Due to a very 49 intensive period with receiving new students, Student board began their work with 50 reorganization after the august block was finished. The following has been done up until the Student Parliament 5. 51 52 Student board has held four internal seminars aimed at preparation and monitoring of dates 53 and instructions that must be revised. There was appointed a committee to examine the 54 composition of the Student Parliament with regard to the new academic structure consisting of 55 seven faculties. There have been held two workshops with Student Councils to ensure that the Student Board gets the input from the bottom up, and to get a better understanding of the 56 57 situation that former departments find themselves in. The workshops have been focused 58 towards marketing, information flow and standardization of student councils at the seven new 59 faculties. 60 The president of the student board, Mariya Khanamiryan, presented the current status of the 61 62 reorganization process. 63 64 The student board has appointed a committee. It consists of the following people; Anne Aase-Mæland (HH), Runar Bakken Smedås (ILP), Even 65 66 Bremnes Stokke (INA) and Ingrid Wigestrand (former vice president of the student board). 67 There has been arranged two workshops for the president and vice president of the student council. One more will also be held. It will be on October 25th. The student board will present 68 69 additional information about the following reorganization after this date. 70 A draft will be presented at that workshop that will discuss the reorganization of the new 71 faculties in regards to student democracies. 72 73 Two student representatives will be chosen to the new faculty board. They will be chosen 74 through an electronic vote using NMBU's digital election portal. The tentative dates chosen for 75 this process will be between November 30th and December 5th. Two permanent and two
- 76 deputy representatives will be chosen.

- 77 Candidates for this election will be presented on the constituent student parliament on
- Monday, the 28th of November. According to NMBU's election regulations, there must be a male
 and a female candidate/representative.

- 104 1653.1 Possible Economic Support for ESN
 - Case responsible: Jonas Wettre Thorsen
- 106107 **Purpose:**
- 108 To strengthen NMBU's involvement with the Erasmus Student Network (ESN), both locally and
- 109 internationally. This is to improve information, and protect NMBU's exchange students and
- 110 their social opportunities by giving ESN Ås 15,000 NOK over a period of 3 years, with 2,500
- 111 NOK per semester. This is in order to ensure a strong local chapter of the network.
- 112

113 Background:

- As is it understood by the current International Responsible (Jonas Thorsen), ESN has only
- been using inclusion funds. This hinders the growth of the local chapter since inclusion funds
- are designated funds to be used only for events targeting integration and inclusion. As of today,
- 117 inclusion funds total almost 200,000 NOK per year. An expenditure of 5,000 per year will
 118 therefore here are all amount but will circuit control of 500 per year will
- therefore be a small amount, but will significantly aid ESN in the short and long run. This will
- 119 ensure a more active committee that can strengthen buddyweeks, exchange, and lead to
- increased activity at NMBU. By supporting the local chapter of ESN with these funds, they willbe able to spend money as they see fit for continued operation. We will therefore require a
- report of the usage of funds to be submitted along with the other mandatory minute reports.

 been allocated in spring, 44 527 NOK has been allocated to the Community Funds, the
 remaining 32 000 NOK will be distributed at the autumn allocation.

- 184 Attached you can find the suggested allocation proposal autumn 2016 (Appendix 2) and the list 185 of applications (Appendix 1). In the autumn 2016 we received 30 applications applying for the 186 total amount of 228 792 NOK. The welfare committee proposes to allocate the remaining 32 000 NOK. Several applications and activities were not considered either due to breach with the 187 188 rules and regulations, or because they had received funds earlier. There were also several 189 application that were difficult to assess due to several grev areas that have been discovered in 190 the regulations, because of that committee believes that a further detailed work with the rules is necessary. 191

320 321	that you need to have your student card or key card activated for that building. This creates unnecessary challenges for students and is unfair to be based on which institute a student
321	belongs to. In addition these restrictions seem inappropriate at a university where increased
323	cooperation for collaboration across departments is a stated and very poignant goal.

607 **Powers and Functions**

The control committee is an advisory board that is responsible for reporting to the StudentParliament about regulations and protocol.

- 610
- 611 The control committee, by request or self-initiation, investigates if protocol is being followed.
- The control committee can overrule the Student Parliament with a 2/3 vote.
- 613
- 614 The control committee is required to attend the Student Parliament with at least 2 members.
- 615 One of these two members must be the committee leader. The job of the control committee at
- 616 Student Parliament meetings is to assist the parliament and the Student Board when necessary.
- 617 Furthermore, the control committee will oversee that statutes, regulations and protocol is
- 618 followed at the meetings.
- 619

The current control committee is responsible for adequate overlap with new members of thecommittee. Overlap consists of two meetings before the next Student Parliament. This means

- 622 that for the members chosen at Student Parliament 3, the overlap should be completed before
- 623 Student Parliament 4. For the new leader, the overlap should happen before Student
- Parliament 1. The first meeting will be about the practice of the control committee together
- 625 with the Student Parliament. The second meeting will be about cases from the past year that
- 626 the outgoing members have handled.

628 Other Guidelines

The members of the control committee may not be a part of other committees in the student

- democracy during their time in the committee. If the members hold previous positions in thestudent democracy, their previous positions will be invalid immediately upon election into the
- 632 control committee.
- 633

634 **Composition and Duration**

635 The control committee consists of 3 members, one of which being the leader, and 2 deputies.

- The leader does not get a double vote. The committee is selected by the Student Parliament.
- The leader is chosen at Student Parliament 6, and other members are chosen at Student
- Parliament 3. The members of the control committee hold their position for the duration of 1year.

641 Changes to the Working Instructions

The Student Parliament must approve the working instructions for the control committee with a 2/3 vote from all representatives at parliament. Proposals to change the working instructions will be taken up by the control committee, and must be approved of by the Student Parliament.
