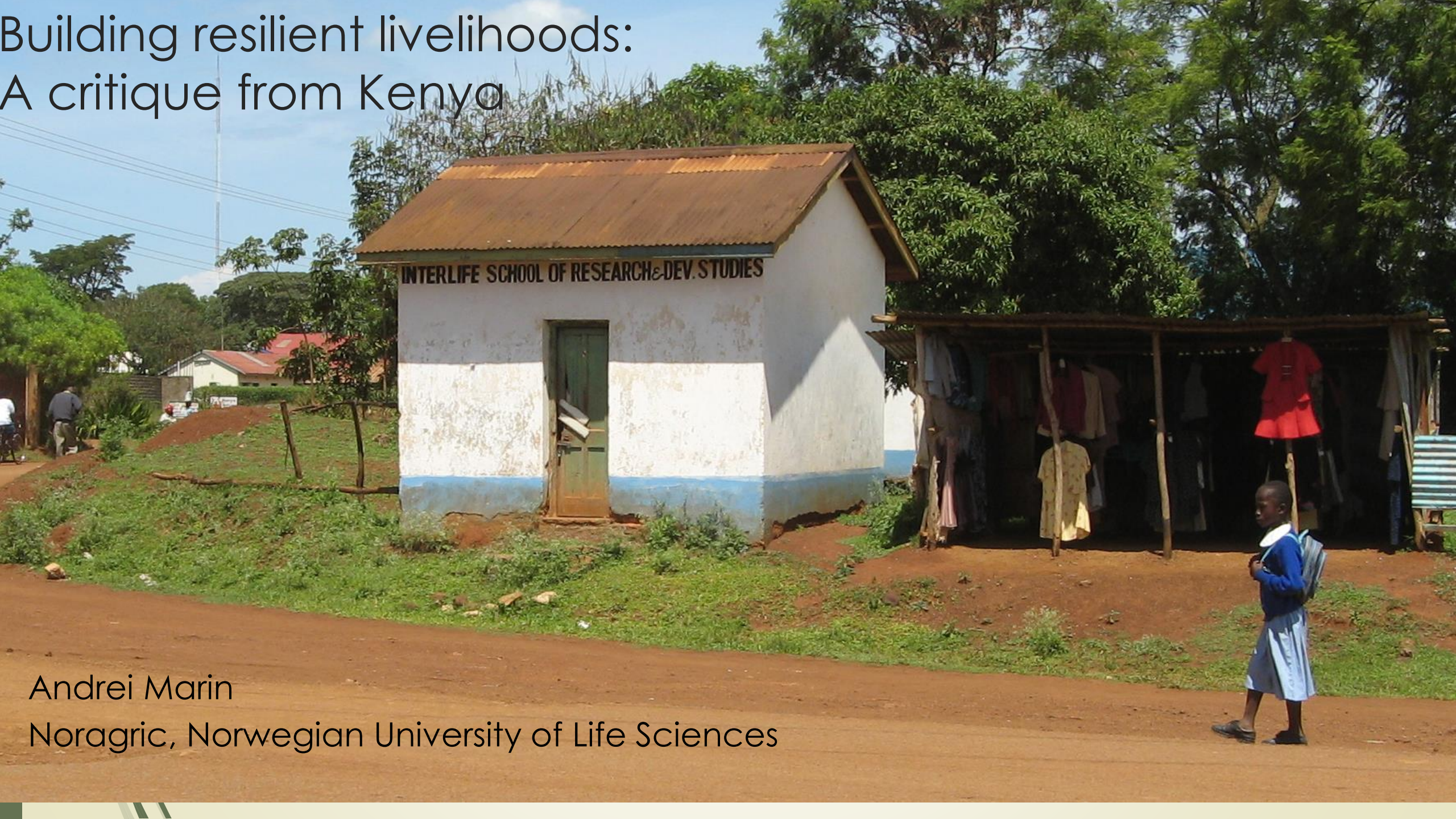

 - ▶ 'long-term' (26 mths- extended to 48)
 - ▶ Multi-purpose & multi-cluster
 - ▶ Preventive
- ▶ Integrated Food (and Livelihood) Security
- ▶ Food security – improved cassava harvests; improved income from sales
