## 2. Planning of the NOVA Strategy Seminar 2017

The NOVA Strategy Seminar 2017 will be hosted by UEF-F and take place on 8-9 June in Joensuu and Koli, Finland. NOVA and NSB board members, local NOVA coordinators, the central NovA coordinator will be invited. The new NOVA Strategy 2018-2021 will be the main topic. Bioeconomy will be another.

Jouni Pykäläinen, NOVA board member from UEF-F, gave an orientation on the preliminary schedule. The main points on the agenda on day 1 will be the seminar on the new strategy and a workshop on bioeconomy. On day 2, there will be meetings for the NSB, the NOVA Board and the local NOVA coordinators.

The Secretariat presented the framework for the part of the seminar concerning the new strategy. The Secretariat is planning to draft a new strategy before the seminar. The draft will be distributed to the Board with the documents to the Board meeting, as well as to the other participants at the seminar. At the seminar, there will be group discussions on topics concerning the new strategy and a summing up of the discussions. If there is time, from the summing up and the notes from the group discussions, the Secretariat will try to make a revised draft strategy to the board meeting on 9 June. Possible topics to be discussed are: digital courses including MOOCs, competence enhancer courses, joint Nordic course planning, dissemination of



course information, financing of PhD students' travel and accommodation costs on PhD courses. Please send topics that you would like to discuss to the Secretariat.

2. At board meeting 76 (9 June 2017), the 2017 budget might be revised to take into account possible adjustments in the activity level. As a result of that, the member fee for 2017 might be reduced.

### **76.5** Annual report 2016

The NOVA Annual Report and Accounts 2016 shows that despite the increase in the number of PhD courses from 12 to 15 courses, the activity level is still low compared to NOVA's ambition of 25-30 PhD courses a year. The number of NOVA students and the total number of students on PhD courses increased considerably in 2016. The network organised one Master's course. KU-HEALTH and KU-SCIENCE have withdrawn from the network, from 1 Jan. 2016 and 1 Jan. 2017, respectively. The background for this is financial issues at KU. Thus, the pool of teachers who can apply for organising courses and the NOVA student pool is reduced. The network continued focusing on augmenting the number of PhD courses, while continuing simplifying and streamlining the work. From the figures for 2016, it seems likely that the measures taken since 2014 to increase the number of applications and courses have had an effect. It also seems that applications for course series are becoming more popular. It continued to be challenging for organisers to reach the minimum requirement of 12 NOVA students on courses. As a consequence, in November 2016, the Board approved a new student requirement (10 registered and qualified NOVA students). It has proven challenging to find external funding for NOVA's activities. No new agreements on external funding were made in 2016. It is still important that all involved parties promote NOVA and the courses actively to increase the number of applications and assure that approved courses are held.

- Course 2 (2019) was granted funding of maximum EUR 14 156 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500. The NOVA funding of the course will be dependent on the student evaluations of previous courses within the series, as well as the yearly NOVA course budget.
- Course 3 (2020) was granted funding of maximum EUR 19 767 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500. The NOVA funding of the course will be dependent on the student evaluations of previous courses within the series, as well as the yearly NOVA course budget.
- Course 4 (2021) was granted funding of maximum EUR 14 711 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500. The NOVA funding of the course will be dependent on the student evaluations of previous courses within the series, as well as the yearly NOVA course budget.
- \*\*\*\*Decision on the course series Environmental collaboration and conflict resolution:
- Course 2 (2017) was granted funding of maximum EUR 20 578 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500. The funding of a one-day's excursion, which is included in the maximum grant, is conditioned that the excursion takes place in the five-day's on-site course.

- Course 3 (2017): maximum EUR 10 817 is granted.

- \*\*\*\*\*\*\* Decision on the course series Climate change entomology in the North:
- Course 1 (2017) was granted funding of maximum EUR 16 444 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500.
- \*\*\*\*\*\*\* Decision on the course series Future trends in sustainable plant protection: RNAi technology for insects:
- Course 2 (2017): maximum EUR 6 522 is granted.
- \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*Decision on the course series Nordic Zoo, Wildlife and Conservation Medicine:
- Course 3 (2017): was granted funding of maximum EUR 15 000 flat rate plus an additional guarantee of EUR 10 000 if the course does not receive funding from Nordplus. The guarantee is conditioned that the applicant also applies for funding from Nordplus. The guarantee can apply for costs that are not covered by NOVA according to NOVA's rules.

This guarantee is an exceptional case and shall not set any precedent in NOVA.

### **UEF-F:**

UEF-F is starting collaborating with new partners on teaching ICT.

## HU-V:

No news.

#### **HU-AF:**

The reorganisation of the University is affecting the operational structure at the Faculty. They are planning a new operational structure as there should only be one accountable unit (the Faculty) by the beginning of 2018. Now, there are five departments.

The Faculty is reducing the number of degree programmes. From the autumn 2017, there will be four Bachelor's programmes and seven Master's programmes.

#### SLU:

Ylva Hillbur is SLU's new Pro-Vice-Chancellor in International Relations. This is a new position. SLU's NOVA board member will work with her on international issues, including NOVA.



SLU is slowly taking over the hosting of the NOVA-BOVA-Nordplus Network which they will formally take over from 15 June 2017. On 1 Mar. 2017, the network submitted an application to Nordplus for the academic year 2017/2018. The current central coordinator, will visit SLU this spring for knowledge transfer.

#### LBHI:

The previous NOVA board member, Björn Porsteinsson, is withdrawing as a Rector of LBHI. He will continue as a Professor at the University. LBHI hopes to have a new Rector by the autumn 2017. In 2017, the economy of the University has improved as it received more funding than expected. LBHI is in a better situation now than for many years. The University is still implementing the new Icelandic university regulations which came in 2016. Two faculties have merged to one. They are reviewing the curriculum, different processes etc.

#### **AU-ST:**

No news.

#### NSB:

NSB had a meeting on 29 Mar. 2017. The NSB is quite pleased with the number of courses. It is still difficult for students from UEF-F to participate on NOVA courses as there is practically no funding available for travel.

#### NMBU:

From 1 Jan. 2017, there are seven faculties at NMBU and two pro-rectors. Currently, NMBU is in the process of employing new deans and pro-rectors. The NMBU Board has hired the current Rector Mari Sundli Tveit as Rector for the period 2017-2021.

### 76.8 Other issues

No other issues were raised.
