78.1 Approval of the agenda and of minutes of board meeting 77

Resolution:

The Board approved the agenda for board meeting 78 and the minutes of board meeting 77.

78.2 Orientation issues

1. NOVA Strategy Seminar 2018, and NOVA Board and BOVA Rector's Board meeting

According to the NOVA Strategy, there should be a NOVA strategy seminar each year. Participants are the board members, local coordinators, the Nordplus coordinator and the NOVA Student Board. Other experts and participants can be invited depending on the topic for the seminar. The purpose of the seminar is to "examine how well the goals have been attained and, if relevant, to prepare an activity plan for two years at a time, and to ensure that all the NOVA functions are focused on achieving the mission, vision and the goals defined in the strategy." As earlier, the Strategy



Seminar 2018 will be combined with the meeting between the NOVA Board and the BOVA Rectors' Board that is to take place every three years, according to the collaboration agreement between NOVA and BOVA. The Veterinary Academy at the Lithuanian University of Health Sciences has kindly agreed to host the seminar in Kaunas, Lithuania on 7-8 June 2018. The NOVA Chair has decided that the topic of the NOVA Strategy Seminar 2018 will be UN's sustainable development goals.

NOVA's financial situation and funding of activities will also be addressed at the Strategy Seminar. The NSB wished to have a meeting with the BOVA Student Board during the meeting in Kaunas in June 2017.

<u>Resolution:</u> The Board noted the information.

2. Verbal presentation by the Secretariat

Candidate for the steering committee for the Nordic Public Private Partnership on Pre-breeding The NOVA Chair has given the consent to prolongation of Professor Rodomiro Ortiz's (SLU) mandate as a representative in the steering committee for the Nordic Public Private Partnership on Pre-breeding for the period 2018-2020.

Aalto University

The section on Landscape Architecture at Aalto University (Finland) contacted the NOVA Secretariat this autumn regarding their wish to establish a Nordplus network within landscape architecture. The Secretariat informed them of the NOVA-BOVA Nordplus network.

Resolution:

The Board noted the information presented by the Secretariat.

78.3 Follow-up on NOVA Strategy Seminar 2017: NOVA Strategy 2018-2021

The NOVA Network has discussed workload per ECTS credit on NOVA courses and course recognition of NOVA courses several times. However, the current regulations for NOVA courses on hours of workload per ECTS credit are more extensive than the local regulations at several NOVA institutions. Moreover, in 2017, at one of the NOVA institutions, doubt was raised regarding the number of ECTS credits of a specific NOVA course held some years ago.

Resolution:

The following resolutions regarding workload per ECTS credit and course recognition on NOVA courses shall be included in NOVA's regulations:

a. All courses must fulfil the requirements at the NOVA member institution offering the course concerning the number of hours of workload per ECTS credit in line with the ECTS User's Guide where one ECTS credit



corresponds to 25-30 hours of workload. For NOVA courses applied for and approved before 1 January 2018, the approved number of hours of workload per ECTS credit applies.

b. All NOVA member institutions should commit to recognising automatically all credits of a NOVA course for participating students if the course does not overlap with other courses and is fully relevant for the student's curriculum.

78.4 Follow-up on NOVA Strategy Seminar 2017: NOVA Strategy 2018-2021

Enclosure: Strategy 2018-2021

The main topic for the NOVA Strategy Seminar 2017 was the development of the NOVA Strategy 2018-2021. The Secretariat had prepared a draft strategy for the Seminar. On the first day of the Seminar, 8 June, there were group discussions concerning defined topics, followed by a summing up. Each group handed in summaries from the group discussion. The Secretariat prepared a new draft strategy which the Board discussed at board meeting 77 on 9 June. Taking into account comments from board meeting 77 and the NOVA Strategy Seminar 2017, the Secretariat was to prepare a final proposal for the NOVA Strategy 2018-2021 for NOVA board meeting 78.

Resolution:

- 1. The Board approved the NOVA Strategy 2018-2021.
- 2. The approved Strategy shall be sent to proofreading.

78.5 Approval of regulations for NOVA courses and other projects, including a question from the NSB whether NOVA could support students with a small travel pot

Enclosure: Regulations for NOVA courses and other projects

For the NOVA Strategy Seminar 2017, the Secretariat prepared a draft for regulations for NOVA courses and other projects to include all regulations in one document. At the Strategy Seminar, items concerning the regulations were discussed. The NOVA coordinators discussed the draft at their meeting on 7 June 2017. The draft regulations were also briefly presented to the NOVA Board at board meeting 77 on 9 June 2017. At that meeting, the Board gave the Secretariat the mandate to propose a new simplified funding model for NOVA courses for board meeting 78. In November 2017, the Secretariat presented revised draft regulations to the NOVA coordinators.

In addition, at board meeting 77, the NOVA Student Board proposed that NOVA could support NOVA students taking NOVA courses with a small travel pot if they did not receive any other funding for that. The Board decided that this item was to be discussed at board meeting 78.

Regulations

The Board was invited to choose between two alternatives for new financing models for PhD and Master's courses. One alternative was very similar to the current regulations, and the other consisting of 1)



regulations for courses applied before 1 Jan. 2018, and 2) simplified regulations for courses applied after 1 Jan. 2018. The main reasons for the proposal in alternative 2 were to make it easier for teachers and administrative staff to understand and follow the regulations, and to reduce administration. Teachers had also claimed that the detailed regulations made many reluctant to apply for funding. Granting incentive money to encourage that NOVA's priorities are met was also a part of the proposal. A lump sum plus incentive grants could contribute to more predictability regarding actual payments and could reduce the costs for NOVA courses in the long term with respect to the increasing cost level on NOVA courses and the increase in demanded grants.

Travel support for NOVA students

During the last years, several courses have been cancelled due to lack of students. However, the requirement regarding students was relaxed in 2016 (resolution 75.7), and far less courses were cancelled in 2017 than in 2016. Even though some NOVA institutions have improved the accessibility of grants for example by changing application deadlines, it is not the case at all NOVA institutions. The NSB claimed that if the students had a travel pot as a back-up solution, it would be easier to attend the courses, also in cases where funding is temporarily unavailable at some institutions. The NSB also argued that it is important for students to meet and create a network, and that all of NOVA would benefit from supporting students who do not receive the money.

Resolution:

 The Board approved the proposed regulations for NOVA PhD and Master's courses and other projects and alternative two. As a pilot, courses approved in the period 1 Jan. 2018 to 31 Dec. 2019, meeting the criteria detailed in the regulations, will receive a total lump sum for PhD and Master's courses exceeding €5,000 of €10,000, which is a flat rate, plus €1,000 to cover administration plus possible incentive grants of €2,000 as described in the regulations. Master's courses not exceeding €5,000 will receive a total lump sum of €4,500, which is a flat rate, plus €500 to cover administration.

The Board decided that whether a PhD activitity can give ECTS credits should be decided case by case.

2. The Board did not approve the proposal regarding NOVA providing travelling support to NOVA students for attending NOVA courses. The home institution of the NOVA student is responsible for facilitating that the student receive funding to attend NOVA courses.

The NOVA board members from the NOVA Student Board did not agree with resolution 78.5.2 above.

78.6 Approval of activity plan 2018-2019

According to NOVA's Statutes, one of the Board's responsibilities is to adopt two-year activity plans. The local NOVA coordinators received a draft activity plan for 2018-2019 to comment on in October 2017.



The activity plan for 2018-2019 follows the lines of the plan for 2016-2017. It is updated according to the Strategy for 2018-2021 and regulations for NOVA PhD and Master's courses and other projects, presented in items 78.4 and 78.5, respectively. Some of the most important tasks in the period will be to implement and communicate the changes resulting from the new Strategy and regulations, to find external funding to maintain the activity level, and strengthen the awareness of NOVA at the member institutions.

Resolution:

The Board approved the proposed activity plan for 2018-2019.

78.7 Accounts by November 2017 and approval of budget 2018

Table 1 below contains an overview of accounts 2016, accounts by November 2017, approved budget for 2017, as well as the approved budget for 2018. Table 2 shows NOVA's current probable future commitments regarding PhD and Master's courses if the Board approves all applications in the 3rd round of the NOVA Open Call 2017 with the proposed amounts. Member fee percentages for 2018-2019, as well as member fee for 2018 are also presented.

- Course 1 (2018) was granted funding of maximum EUR 15 767 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500.

**The course is part of the course series Biodiversity and Integrated Pest Management. It was originally scheduled for running in 2016, but was rescheduled to 2018.

- Decision: maximum EUR 10 856 is granted.

***The course is part of the series Environmental collaboration and conflict resolution.

- Course 3 (2018) was granted funding of maximum EUR 21 311 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500. The funding of a one-day's excursion, which is included in the maximum grant, is conditioned that the excursion takes place in the five-day's on-site course.

****The course is part of the series Plant pathology with a Nordic dimension.

- Course 2 (2018) was granted funding of maximum EUR 17 122 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500.

*****The course is part of the series Climate change entomology in the North.

- Course 2 (2018) was granted funding of maximum EUR 18 667 plus an incentive grant to be used on administration of EUR 2 500.

****** The course is part of the series Future trends in sustainable plant protection: RNAi technology for insects.

- Course 3 (2018): maximum EUR 6 333 is granted.
