39 SAIH stands for Students and Academics International Assistance fund, and is the students' and  
40 academics' own organization for international solidarity. We believe education is an important  
41 tool for liberation and change in the society, and in students, academics and higher education  
42 institutes as important actors in the society. SAIH works with the right to academic freedom  
43 and equal right for good higher education.

44

45 Paying the SAIH tenners is voluntary; students can choose to pay 40 kroner to SAIH every time  
46 they pay the semester fee. The tenners make up an important part of SAIH's economy, and  
47 make it able for SAIH to do solidarity work with 32 organizations in 7 countries in Latin  
48 America, Southern Africa and Asia. SAIH works, among other things with strengthening  
49 indigenous peoples rights to relevant and good education, documenting violations directed  
50 towards students and academics, and political advocacy. The tenners are important for SAIH,  
51 and for our partners, and have a long tradition in Norway. Students have voluntarily paid the  
52 SAIH tenners since 1961.

### 71 **Purpose:**

72 To inform the Student Parliament on the various positions that are up for election at the  
73 Constituent Student Parliament.

74

### 75 **Background:**

76 At the Constituent Student Parliament, on the 26<sup>th</sup> of November 2018, the following positions  
77 are up for election:

78

- 79 • The International Officer of the Student Parliament's Student Board
- 80 • The Welfare Officer of the Student Parliament's Student Board
- 81 • The Marketing Officer of the Student Parliament's Student Board
- 82 • The Sustainability and Research Officer of the Student Parliament's Student Board
- 83 • Main meeting leadership and 2 sub representatives (2 + 2 people)

- The Election Committee (4 people)

All positions in the Student Parliament's Student Board last for 1 year, and those elected at the Constituent Student Parliament start their position on January 1, 2019. In addition to the duties of the position, you will sit in the board with 5 other members. Student Board meetings happen every week, as well as regular office hours. In addition to this, you will have Student Parliament meetings, and other possible meetings/workshops/projects.

The work load distribution for the Student Board is as follows:

- International Officer – 30%
- Welfare Officer– 30%
- Marketing Officer – 20%
- Sustainability and Research Officer– 20%

#### International Officer:

As International Officer, you are responsible for integration measures made at NMBU, including contributing to the introduction week, distribution of inclusion funds, and other advisory roles across campus. It is a very exciting and ever-evolving position for anyone who wants work experience for various sectors, such as sales, administration, and international work. It is also a great way to gain insight into how NMBU works as an organization, as well as the social life on both campuses. As International Officer you also work with Samfunnet about things such as international membership and the semester program. This position is strongly recommended to anyone who would like flexible working instructions, routines, personal and academic development as well as a great working environment.

#### Welfare Officer:

The Welfare Officer is a demanding, but very interesting and educational position in the Student Board. As Welfare Officer, you are responsible for the committee that allocates welfare funds, and for the Living Environment Committee. You are also a member of the Learning Environment Committee (LMU) at NMBU, the committee for allocating inclusion funds, and you also will join for meetings with the Health Center, NMBU, Siås, and Samfunnet i Ås. Through the different positions and committees you are in, you will get to try out both smaller and bigger organizational arenas, both as a normal member, and also as a meeting leader. In addition to this, you will also work on welfare policy and cases concerning welfare amongst students at NMBU.

#### Marketing Officer:

As the marketing officer, you are responsible for promoting the Student Parliament, and reaching out to students with information relevant to the. This includes, amongst other things, making posters, keeping in contact with Tuntreet, and updating social media and the website. You should be creative and be able to come up with new ideas for marketing.

#### Sustainability and Research Officer:

As Environment and Research Officer (ERO) you have the opportunity to work with a portion of the University most students don't know deeply, namely the research. As a member of the Research Committee you are part of a very important committee for NMBU. You have in that regard also a responsibility to ensure the follow-up of both central and local representatives in the Research Committee.

This position also represents the students in the Equality and Diversity Committee, Siås Housing Committee and the Environmental Council of NMBU.

135 The position demands an even burden of workload, where you have to come prepared for the  
136 different committees and councils you participate in. Potential representation tasks outside of  
137 NMBU could be important – but not necessary – to attend.  
138 Do you want a better glimpse of the world of research and environment at NMBU, this is the  
139 position you should apply for! Best of luck.

140

141 The Main Meeting Leadership:

142 The Moderator, also called the Meeting Leadership for the Student Parliament, is elected once a  
143 year, and the position lasts from new-year to new-year. The main responsibility of the  
144 moderators is to ensure that Student Parliament meetings make it through the planned agenda  
145 in a orderly and timely fashion.

146

147 The Election Committee:

148 The Election Committee has the main responsibility of finding candidates for all positions up  
149 for election at the Student Parliament, and other student elections at the University level. In  
150 cooperation with the Student Board, you advertise the positions, and prepare the case papers  
151 for election cases. The Election Committee has the option to make their suggestion, and should  
152 do so if they feel it is necessary. Members of the Election Committee are not allowed to run for  
153 any other positions while they are on the committee, except to run for re-election for the  
154 Election Committee. Members of the Election Committee are to attend the Student Parliament's  
155 meetings and events.

167 **Purpose:**

168 To distribute the remaining 8% of welfare funds for Fall 2018.

169

170 **Background:**

171 Every year, the Student Parliament distributes welfare funds to clubs and societies at NMBU. A  
172 committee appointed by the Student Parliament and Student Board works on a proposal for  
173 how to distribute these funds, according to the "Rules for the allocation of welfare funds."

174 In 2018, the Student Parliament can distribute 400,000kr worth of welfare funds. 309 085kr  
175 were given out in the spring distribution, 58,915kr were set aside for welfare meeting funds,  
176 and the remaining 32,000kr is to be given out in the fall distribution.

177

178 **The Committee's Evaluation.:**

179 The proposed allocation for Fall 2018 (attachment 2) and the overview of the applications for  
180 welfare funds Fall 2018 (attachment 1) are attached. 12 applications were submitted for the  
181 fall distribution, and a total of 78050kr was applied for. Several applications were rejected  
182 because they either did not follow the regulations, or were given funds during the spring  
183 distribution. There were also a few applications that were difficult to judge, but the committee

184 feels that they have come up with a fitting and just allocation proposal. The remaining 6,950kr  
185 will be given to the Welfare Fund, and leaders of the Student Parliament, committee leaders in  
186 Siås, and the leaders of Samfunnet can come up with proposals for the Student Parliament on  
187 how they can use this fund to increase Welfare measures.

216 Approve resolution for better student economy and scholarship regulations

217  
218 **Background:**

219 On October 8., the state budget for 2019 was put forth. This suggests changing the conversion  
220 rate for the loan to scholarship. The government wants 15% of the current 40% to be linked to  
221 a finished degree, instead of the current measure, point production.

222 The Student Board is critical of this, as it could impact the debts of students that change studies  
223 or take classes and courses that won't be implemented in their degree. The Student Board does  
224 not think this is the way to go to increase the amount of student finishing their degrees and  
225 that the government should rather look at other measures that may increase degree  
226 accomplishment.

238    **Purpose**

239    To discuss whether a Student Parliament representative who is running for a position elected  
240    at Student Parliament should be allowed to vote under that election.

241

242    **Background**

243    Every now and then, a Student Parliament representative will run for a position elected at  
244    Student Parliament. Many times, they are elected by acclamation, but sometimes there is an  
245    actual election. In such situations the question of hability might arise, especially if one the  
246    candidates is not in the Student Parliament, and as such does not have the right to vote  
247    themselves. Hability cases can take up a lot of unnecessary time, and it would be preferable  
248    that our statutes cover this. We therefore want the Student Parliament to assess what they  
249    consider the most useful practice, so that it is possible to make a decision at the next Student  
250    Parliament.

304 The National Meeting is the highest organ of NSO. The biggest and most important decisions in

307 members, etc. The National Meeting is arranged once a year, and includes representatives from

## 389 Program of Principles for the Student Parliament at NMBU

390 Approved: XX.XX.2018 (up for revision every third year.)

391

### 392 Quality of Studies

393 Higher Education is a common good which shall be available to all. The Student Parliament is of  
394 the impression that the principle of free higher education is one of the most important factors  
395 to ensure this. As such it is deemed unacceptable to introduce any tuition or exclude any given  
396 group from the academic community. The Student Parliament regards this principle as a  
397 universal right and should as such be included in all higher education institutions worldwide.  
398 The Student Parliament will work to ensure that higher education becomes a common good  
399 accessible to all at a global scale.

400

- 401 • All shall have equal access to education at NMBU and in the rest of the world.

402 Quality in education is important. Modern teaching methods built on student active learning  
403 shall be the norm at NMBU. It must be facilitated for exchange and internships in all study  
404 programs at NMBU.

405

- 406 • NMBU shall provide education of high quality.

407 The Student Parliament view diversity as something good and want different measures to be  
408 taken in order to ensure a diverse student mass and staff at NMBU.

409

- 410 • Diversity must be secured in both the study and academic community.

411 Students shall actively participate in the research conducted at our university and research is  
412 to be used as a part of the education and teaching. We are of the opinion that research results  
413 are something to be available for all, and not a select group. The principle of OpenAccess is  
414 therefore important to the Student Parliament.

415

- 416 • The Student Parliament supports Open Access

417 NMBU is a university with a focus on environment and sustainability, and this should be  
418 apparent in the apparatus around the students. The Municipality, SiÅs and NMBU must  
419 therefore facilitate an environmentally friendly operation that ensures a sustainable society.  
420 NMBU does also have a responsibility to ensure that relevant sustainability focus is secured in  
421 the study programs of all students.

422

- 423 • NMBUs partners shall have a sustainable operation and business model.
- 424 • There shall be a focus on sustainability in all study programs.

425

### 426 Welfare

427 To ensure good health and high quality in education it is important that students use their time  
428 to study. It is therefore important to increase the financial support of students to achieve full  
429 time students. The Student Parliament at NMBU think it important to raise the support of  
430 students above the Norwegian poverty line. This to remove the necessity of a part time job that  
431 compromise academic results.

432

- 433 • The students financial support must be raised to 1,5G

434 To ensure environmentally friendly transportation and keep NMBU as an attractive study and  
435 workplace, the public transportation system must be increased. Transport to and from campus  
436 must be better, and the trains should leave the station every 15. minutes between Ås and Oslo.  
437

- 438 • The public transportation must be better

439 All students and employees shall have a good and safe study and work environment.  
440

- 441 • There shall be a good and safe study and work environment at NMBU and SiÅs.

442 SiÅs shall be the main provider of homes for students at NMBU. It is therefore important to  
443 build more student housing. To ensure a high feeling of wellbeing and good health among  
444 students, the land lords must ensure a good living environment for the students. SiÅs shall also  
445 secure other welfare options like cafeterias and sports at a low cost for students.  
446

- 447 • SiÅs will deliver sufficient housing to ensure students experience a good living situation.

448 Ås municipality must take their share of the responsibility as a host municipality and secure a  
449 quick application process for housing projects and ensure measures to strengthen students  
450 psychological health. It must be ensured that all students have adequate access to general  
451 practitioners and options to exercise to ensure a good physical health.  
452

- 453 • The services at the health station must be improved, especially with focus on mental  
454 health.

463 The Student Parliament at NMBU feels that the student economy needs to be strengthened to  
464 improve the quality and degree accomplishment with the students. Studying is a demanding  
465 full-time job, and it is therefore important that students receive sufficient financial support so  
466 they don't have to work in addition to studying. Studying does not only benefit the individual,  
467 but also society. That's why it is reasonable for the government to invest in the students with a  
468 scholarship equal to 40% of the student financial support.

469

470 When the Norwegian Parliament assesses what measures to take to make more students finish  
471 their degrees, looking to cut down on the scholarship is not the way to go. This will lead to a  
472 less flexible study situation by robbing the students of the financial freedom to change their  
473 study programs after they've started. Many students will feel forced to continue studies they  
474 don't want to finish due to fear of financial repercussions. The Student Parliament would  
475 rather have the Norwegian Parliament consider other options to motivate students to finish  
476 their studies, and find new ways to ensure that students find the right study program for them  
477 from the beginning.

479 The Student Parliament at NMBU thinks that:

- 480 • The student financial support must be increased to 1.5G
- 481 • The scholarship should remain unchanged at 40% and follow study point production
