There was conducted a round of presentations where everyone presented themselves. The chair presented the routines and case papers for the Student Parliament for all the new representatives.
A comment from the Control Committee with regards to a broken statute by holding the meeting at this date. This because not all faculties have had their General Assemblies yet. Explanation from the Student Board: The plan of dates was approved by SP 3 during the spring, and it was decided to follow it. That some faculties have decided to move their Assemblies due to unforeseen events should not affect the schedule approved by Student Parliament.
Landsam: The new from Landsam got the summons today, which is a little short notice.
Additions: VET, Landsam, and Realtek got a short notice due to a miscommunication between General Assemblies, the Vice President, and the Organization Secretary.
The case papers and agenda were approved with comments of a short notice of summons and the statutory breach.

## 1873 Decision Cases

### 1873.1 Proposition for Student Work Space for LANDSAM

## Purpose:

To approve the resolution

## Background:

On Monday 12th of November, it was announced via canvas a policy change regarding allocated work spaces for Master's students in LANDSAM. The announcement as administrative move that is supposed to answer to the lack of working spaces for students in general. Up untill now, the policy has been that every Master's student gets an allocated work space while writing their thesis. The new change to this previous policy is political and agreed upon without the involvement of students. Policies that affect students, by cutting down on available resources should be decided together with the student body, and students' concerns should be a priority.

The Importance Of A Work Space:
Having an allocated work space creates an important framework for Master's students. It is a permanent office where the research and work derived from it can be developed in a consistent environment. Having a stable working space simply creates the desirable physical predictability that helps stabilize the writing process. Thesis writing is a process that is already highly unpredictable and stressful. It is essential for students to have their books, printed texts, writing and drawing tools, computers, food, mind maps and other daily resources close at
hand. It is unreasonable to expect Master's students to carry this amount of items with them every day from one place to another. In addition, searching for a work space reduces the amount of time set for the thesis work. Writing a thesis is doing research, which is producing work on behalf of NMBU. We therefore require allocated working spaces, as we were promised when we began our degrees at NMBU.

The Student Parliament therefore proposes that:

- Allocated desk for students writing their Master's thesis stays as a policy
- Changes in policies that affect students should be consulted first with relevant committees such as the educational committee If there is a change in work space policy, that Master's students must be given another allocated desk where they can work


## The Student Boards proposal

The Student Parliament decides against the proposal, and proposing an amendment.
Student Parliament received a written amendment to the case during the meeting from the Student Board. The recommendation from the Student Board is to approve the amendment.

No questions of a clarifying nature.
Debate:
Biovit: Are we meant to vote now? Need some time to read through the document.
Mina: Should we not work with this now for the current Master Students?
Control Committee: The plan is already put into action. The Student Board can work with this already, even without a formal approval in this case.

Student Board: The reason for this amendment is because it has already happened - The Board is currently working with it.

Since the proposed amendment presents extensive changes in content to the resolution, it was a wish from the representatives to discuss the proposal with their Student Councils. It is proposed to move the case to the next Student Parliament.

The case was approved by a majority vote, with 11 for, 4 against, and 4 abstained from casting a vote.
The case will be presented again at Student Parliament 1.

## Purpose

Moving the planned date of the kick-off conference so the veterinary faculty can participate as well.

## Background

The kick-off conference was set to 2.-3. February at Student Parliament 3. The veterinary faculty has cell biology in January and an exam in the start of February, which means they have not been able to participate earlier. This is very unfortunate, and we therefore suggest that we move the kick-off to the weekend $9 .-10$. February so that they can participate as well.

## Proposed decision

The Student Parliament decides that the date of the kick-off conference is moved from the weekend $2 .-3$. February to the weekend $9 .-10$. February.

Questions of a clarifying nature:
KBM: will this change be permanent for all following years?

Student Board: It will change for the coming year, and then it could be considered when a new meeting schedule will be decided on Student Parliament 3 in 2019 for the coming year.

VET: 2 of 3 representatives cannot attend that weekend either, so it would possibly move the kick off for only one person.

The case was up for a vote. 7 for, 2 against, and 9 abstained from the right to vote.
The proposal has been declined. The kick off will be held the 2.-3. February in 2019.

## Purpose:

As a member of the Research Committee you are part of a very important committee for NMBU. ## Purpose:

To elect 2 permanent chairmen and 2 deputies. The position lasts for one year and begins on January 1st, 2019

## Background:

The Facilitators, also known as the Chairmen of the Student Parliament, are elected once a year and sit from New Year to New Year. The main responsibility of the Chairmen is simply to ensure that the Student Parliament goes through the planned agenda in an orderly fashion, and within a reasonable amount of time.
The Chairmen needs to have experience in leading meetings and should preferably have been a part of bigger meetings or many previous Student Parliaments. Normally the Chairmen have a meeting with the president and vice president of the Student Board where they go over the agenda and make a time management plan. Up until now there has been no Control Committee in the Student Parliament, and therefore the Chairmen have had an important role when it is unclear if the Student Parliament is following the regulations and protocol. It is still important
that the Chairmen follow regulated meeting practices, and it is therefore important that they are well-versed in this. To work as a Chairman is interesting and enriching. The position gives both experience with structured meeting leadership and a good insight into the Student Democracy's work here at NMBU.

## Background

The Election Committee has the responsibility of finding candidates for all positions at student parliament and other committees at the university level. Together with the Student Board, they market chosen candidates and prepare election cases for the student parliaments case papers. The election committee has the opportunity to submit their recommendations, and only does so when they find it necessary. The members of the election committee do not have the possibility of running for positions during their time on the committee, except for to re-run for the election committee. The members of the committee must attend the Student Parliament's meetings and arrangements.

As a member of the Election Committee you play an important role in the student democracy! You work actively to reach out to all students at NMBU throughout the whole year to promote the different positions. You can expect close cooperation with the Student Board and Student Councils at the university. As a committee member you will work a lot with social media, email, and designing campaigns.
