




#### Plan your education – your education plan


- You may use the first six months after admission to the PhD programme to plan your PhD education
- The education plan should be drawn up jointly by the PhD candidate and the supervisors

- The education plan must satisfy the requirements stipulated in the current PhD degree regulations, and any detailed specifications from the faculty
- The education plan (and changes to it) must be approved by the NMBU faculty



### The education plan





- a basis for annual progress reports to the faculty
- Elements:
  - An independent work of **research** conducted in collaboration with supervisors
  - Preparation of **publications & PhD thesis** based on the research work
  - Academic dissemination that is closely related to the PhD work
  - Coursework <a href="https://www.nmbu.no/en/research/phd/coursework">https://www.nmbu.no/en/research/phd/coursework</a>
  - 3 compulsory PhD seminars (start, midway and final seminar, guidelines)
     Presenting your plans, research and results & receiving feedback
     Midway assessment seminar of special importance
  - Attaining general skills
  - e.g. academic writing skills, project management, presentations skills
  - Participating in conferences/seminars
  - International mobility

# The academic training component / the required coursework



- Purpose:
  - To raise your competence in specific fields / in general skills
  - to support your research work
- Minimum 30 ECTS, maximum 60 ECTS
- Check your PhD programme's requirements:

- Courses on master or PhD level (bachelor level courses not allowed)
- A research ethics course (min. 5 ECTS) is compulsory for everybody Most PhDs join PHI401 (5 ECTS) or VET400 (5 ECTS)
- All required coursework must be completed and approved by the faculty before you submit your thesis for evaluation
  - plan for and join courses as early as possible



#### **Special Syllabus**



- If no suitable course is available (at NMBU or elsewhere), a Special Syllabus at PhD level may be approved as part of the required coursework
- Before a candidate goes ahead with special syllabus, a written <u>agreement for special syllabus (FORM 3.2)</u> must be approved by the faculty.
