2022.2 Student Elections 2020

Case responsible: The Student Board

Purpose:

To inform the Student Parliament on the upcoming election of the 3 new members of the Student Board, as well as one permanent female representative + substitute for the University Board and each of the faculty boards.

The Student Board:

The Student Board is the Student Democracy's highest organ between Student Parliament meetings. They carry out the daily tasks of the Student Democracy, and follow up on decisions made by the Student Parliament. The Student Board prepares case papers for the Student Parliament. The board shall from 01.07 consists of 3 members: president and 2 board members, in full time positions. The Student Board is a "collective" board, which means that all members are equal within the board. The Student Board also has an organizational secretary.

An electronic vote for the new Student Board will be conducted during the Student Election in 20th - 24th of April.

The president has responsibility for strategic matters, and represents NMBU students in the highest levels of leadership at NMBU and outside of the university. The other members have responsible for organizational matters and work on educational policies. They also work with other representatives in the student democracy to ensure good training and information flow within the organization.

The University Board:

The University Board at NMBU is the highest decision making organ at NMBU and consists of an external committee leader, and committee members that are both internal and external to NMBU.

The University Board works mostly with strategic matters, budgets, goal setting, reporting, and organizational development at an overarching level. The University Board has 7-8 meetings per year. Apart from this, members should meet up for other high level meetings and seminars that concern the work of the board. The Committee members must also report their work to the Student Parliament, and should be represented during parliament meetings.

From students, there should be two main representatives and two substitutes for them. In accordance to regulations there needs to be an equal gender representation, and it has been decided that women are elected in the spring and men in the autumn.

Students who wish to run for the University Board should have experience in committees (institute committees, faculty committees, or similar) or board work experience at a higher level (UFU/USU).

The Faculty Board:

81 The Faculty Board is the faculties' highest decision making organ, and consists of scientific
82 employees, external board members and two student representatives. They work on cases of
83 strategic character and have approximately four meetings a year.

84 Just like the University Board there needs to be equal gender representation, and women are
85 elected in the spring and men in the autumn.

86
87 The representatives in all the boards are elected by electronic vote (Student Elections), start July 1st
88 2020, and sit for a period of one year.

90 **The Student Parliament considers itself oriented with the Student Election.**

101 Approve allocation of Welfare Funds for spring 2019

103 **Background:**

104 The Student Parliament will on Student Parliament 2 approve an allocation of 88,8 % of the
105 funds set aside to Welfare Funds. This year the will be 444 000 kr. From these fund there will
106 also be set aside funds for community meeting funds.

107 The committee for allocation of Welfare Funds suggest to allocate 313 870 kr to student teams
108 and organizations and allocate 130 870 kr to community meeting funds (see attachment).

109 The committee have chosen to increase the percentage of funds for the fall allocation (from 8%
110 in 2019 to 11,2% in 2020), to facilitate the increase of student teams and organizations that
111 will come to Ås from Adamstuen at the beginning of the school year of 2020/2021.

Purpose:

Adopt the Study Quality Document for the Student Parliament at NMBU

Background:

In the 2020 action plan adopted by the Student Parliament, it says "3.8 Make a plan and start working so that the Student Parliament can establish political documents or platforms within areas policies are needed."

We therefore want to start by adopting a Study Quality Document. The document was discussed at SP1 and the Student Board recommends that the Student Parliament adopt the

178 attached proposal.

179

180 It is preferable that the document should reflect the entire student body, regardless of study
181 program. The document is valid for 5 years, so the contents should be timeless enough to hold
182 its own even in the future.

 263 failing or have registered valid absence.
 264 Vote: 18 for, 4 against, 3 indefinite/ abstinent
 265 Proposed change 7 was pulled.

 267 **Proposed change 9:**
 268 Responsible for the proposal: Tord Hauge
 269 Proposed change: (line 422-423): Point out that it is the final exam that counts on the final
 270 grade.
 271 Original text: All courses shall offer a continuation exam for those who fail or are registered
 272 with valid absence.
 273 New text: All courses that have exams that counts on the final grade shall offer a continuation
 274 exam for those who fail or are registered with valid absence.
 275
 276 **Proposed change 10:**
 277 Responsible for the proposal: Magnus Dybdahl
 278 Proposed addition (line 426) Regards all activity. Also field courses and practices.

279 New text: All mandatory activity shall be free to attend, or there shall be a free alternative .
280 Vote: 17 for, 0 against, 8 indefinite/ abstinent

288 *Case responsible: The Student Board*

290 **Attachment 4** Proposed new instructions for the Student Board

291

292 **Purpose:**

293 Approve new instructions for the Student Board.

294

295 **Background:**

296 The Student Parliament has decided that the Student Board shall comprise of three people
297 working full time from the summer 2020; one president and two Student Board members. Due
298 to this, the instruction for the Student Board must be revised.

299 The working instruction was put forth for clarifying questions at SP1. None of the points have
300 been changed since Student Parliament 1, but the work tasks have been categorized after input
301 at the meeting.

302 There are few changes in the tasks of the Student Board. The largest difference is that the tasks
303 are no longer tied to a person, but that the tasks must be divided inside the Student Board
304 elected by the students at NMBU.

305 If the instruction is approved, it will come into effect when the new Student Board starts their
306 terms, 01.07.20.

307

308 **Proposed decision:**

309 The Student Parliament approves the new instructions for the Student Board as they are in
310 appendix 4.

313 **New instructions for the Student Board was discussed, and proposed changes were**
314 **presented.**

315

316 **Proposed change 1:**

317 Responsible for the proposal: Even August Bremnes Stokke

318 Proposed change: With background in the case of reorganizing the Student Board , it was
319 discussed that the role of The Student Board should be revised. I myself think that the Student
320 Parliament have not had the opportunity to discuss the roles in the important
321 organizations(utvalg). We are changing to a model where we as students not actively choose
322 who will represent us in these organizations, because the Student Board shall decide this
323 amongst themselves.

324

325 Historically the Student Board was quite recently awarded of a seat in the UFU, and it was
326 decided that they got this position for the Environment and sustainability officer, because this
327 is newly established. The vice president has previously held a position in the USU, but this is

328 still based on that there were student representatives, today there are only 3 seats reserved for
 329 representatives from the Student Parliament.
 330
 331 I feel that the people that are to sit in these organizations should be elected by the Student
 332 Parliament in order to ensure that the voice of the students are heard , and that the Student
 333 Board shall focus on rather follow up these students in the organizations.
 334
 335 Original text: The Student Board shall be represented in..... USU, UFU, LMU.
 336 New text: The Student Board shall follow up student representatives in USU, UFU and LMU, as
 337 well as see that decisions are executed.
 338
 339 Vote: 2 for, 21 against, 2 indefinite/abstinent
 340 **The proposal fell**

 348 *Case responsible The student Board*
 349
 350 **Attachment 5** Proposed new Framework for the working year of the Student Democracy
 351
 352 **Purpose:**
 353 Approve new framework for the working year of the Student Democracy
 354
 355 **Background:**
 356 Due to the changes in the composition of the Student Board starting this summer, it is
 357 necessary to revise the framework for the working year of the Student Democracy. Most of the
 358 changes are tied to this.
 359 In addition, we see it as favourable to move the election of participants for NSO's annual
 360 meeting, as one usually is not informed of the number of delegates you can elect before after
 361 Student Parliament 5. The Student Board therefore suggests moving the election to SP6, as well
 362 as removing the specification of how many participants to elect. This is because the number of
 363 participants might vary from year to year.
 364
 365 The Student Board also suggests adding the election of student representatives for the
 366 Learning Environment Committee (LMU) at Student Parliament 3. This change is tied to the
 367 proposal made at the LMU-meeting 26.02.20 regarding changing the statutes for LMU tied to
 368 student representation.
 369
 370 **Proposed decision:**

 388 for the Student Parliament, because they are already present there. Better to have it set in the
 389 rules.

 392 New text: Studenting (representatives, chairmen, election committee, Control Committee) and
 393 presidents and vice presidents of the Student Councils.

407 **Attachment 6** Proposed Environmental Policy Document

409 **Purpose:**

410 Discuss the proposed content and what the Student Parliament wants to include in an
 411 Environmental Policy document. Provide input for the final environmental policy document
 412 that will be passed at ST3.

414 **Background:**

415 The Action Plan Adopted by the Student Parliament states "3.8 Create a plan and start the work
 416 for the Student Parliament to establish political documents or platforms in areas where there is a
 417 need for policy." At Student Parliament 1, it was decided that we will introduce political
 418 documents, and that they will be processed during a timespan of two student parliaments.
 419 Therefore, we will discuss the Environmental Policy document at this meeting, and the final
 420 recommendation of the Environmental policy document will be passed from the Student
 421 Board on Student Parliament 3. There is a wish for the document to be reflective of the entire
 422 student body, regardless of study program. The document is supposed to be valid for 5 years,
 423 implying the content should be timeless enough to move forward in time.
 424 On February 17th 2020, the Sustainability Committee was created by the Student Board, which
 425 has been the leading force in the drafting of this proposal. The Sustainability Committee is an

426 advisory group, consisting of 4 students and one representative from the Student Board. Their
427 intention is to submit proposals and input to the Student Board, which then will recommend a
428 comprehensive proposal for ST3.

466 2025.2 Election of representatives to the board of complaints

467 *Case responsible: The Student Board*

468 **Purpose:**

469 To elect two main representatives and two deputy representatives to the board of complaints.

470 **Background:**

471 We need two students to sit in the board of complaints, and two deputies for these students. This is
472 a paid position where one gets paid for two hours of preparation time, in addition to the entire
473 meeting. A meeting lasts an entire working day. The board of complaints amongst other things
474 handles complaints over formal errors with exams, and annulments of exams or tests. It is also the
475 board of complaints that handles complaints about teaching and the learning environment. The
476 position can be fitting for students interested in law, but that is not a requirement. The position
477 begins on July 1, 2020 and lasts one year. There is about 6-8 meetings a year.

478 Two main and two deputy representatives are to be chosen, and the representatives will hold the
479 position for one year.

- The President is to take responsibility in unexpected and unforeseen situations.
- The President shall work with the strategic outlook of the student democracy – both short and long term.
- The President shall speak up to bigger actors, for example the municipality and county, if beneficial for the students at NMBU.
- The leader shall facilitate good cooperation with the University Board and SiÅs.
- The President is responsible for the finances of the Student Parliament.
- The President shall represent the students in the Rector's Leadership Group (RLG).
- The President is responsible for Student Board meetings.
