Attachment 1: Overview over Student Parliaments running expenses

## Purpose:

To inform the Student Parliament about the economic situation of the Student Democracy before the president currently in charge is finished.

## Background:

The numbers in the appendix are from March 23 ${ }^{\text {rd }}$, which means less than three months into the current year. Additionally, we're now in a period where it is very difficult to foresee what will happen moving forward, and we must plan for an uncertain future. At the same time, it is important for me to stress that there is no increased economical risk for the Student Democracy, and that the economy is stable and safe. Because of Covid-19 and the consequences of this, it might result in a profit for the Student Democracy in 2020, as it is uncertain if we can arrange the events and other things we planned for in the budget. It is also important to note that some expenses for the period won't be in the report because the invoice hasn't been received yet. I will therefore be commenting briefly on each of the operating expense posts.

There is to a great extent an underuse on the posts, and it is difficult to say exactly where they will be on July $1^{\text {st. }}$. With the current situation, we have to plan for multiple scenarios and it is comforting for the financial situation that we have means to be able to have events and do visible work for the Student Democracy in the fall 2020.
The large post with expenses is Courses, education and training, where we have spent $71.765,33 \mathrm{kr}, 65.000 \mathrm{kr}$ of this is the bill from Sørmarka and the kick-off conference in addition to paying for the bus. It is planned to arrange a conference for student representatives in the fall that will add some costs. In addition, there is going be courses for student representatives at the faculties after the general assemblies, and a seminar for the new Student Board. There are also different courses and seminars that might be relevant for some members of the Student Board to go to during the fall.

We haven't spent a lot on translation, but we are planning to be good at translating in the Student Parliament. It's also planned to use this post to translate some of the existing material that we have and not just case papers, like for example the website.
Office supplies have barely been touched; this is probably because the expenses are for a rather short period. There will also be more expenses when the Student Board is replaced. We have also planned to buy some cutlery and plates for the office so we can reduce the use of plastic cutlery.
Miscellaneous operating expenses is quite full, this is an important buffer account that gives us the possibility to cover unforeseen expenses, or strategic initiatives.
We have already gone above budget by 92 kr on postage. This is because this year's Christmas cards were sent out (in December), but was reported for January. I don't see it as very critical that we've gone above budget here but have ensured that the recipient list has been
considerably reduced. The next Student Board can also consider if they want to send the Christmas card digitally.

We've spent no funds on marketing yet, this because we planned to spend a lot on marketing the Student Elections. With the situation as is, we stand to use less than previously assumed, but we plan to spend some on for example promoting posts on Facebook. We were also granted 20.000 kr from NSO to spend on marketing of the election, and to make videos with the Learning Center. This has now been put on hold. Still, we think it is good to have marketing funds for the fall, both during Fadderuka and generally that semester. We're also considering what merch we want to acquire. We think it is important to buy something people will actually make use of, and not a lot of random junk nobody wants.
The Meetings, travel and representation post looks to be quite normal. There will be some expenses here in the fall due to gathering in the U-network that we are part of. There is also extra funds there, so we can cover environmentally friendly travels, even if this sometimes costs more.

The NSO fee hasn't been paid yet, and as the move of the veterinary school has been postponed, we might have less expenses there. The cost 2020 is 32 kr per student per semester belonging to SiÅs. The membership for students at the veterinary school is covered through SiO and the Welfare Parliament there.
We haven't spent much on Student Parliament meetings, as we had originally planned a larger event with dinner together at Student Parliament 3. These are plans we hope can be followed through with in the fall.

There are also some funds left on Campus transportation. I think this can be a positive thing now that the move has been delayed, and there might still be a need to travel between campuses, especially for the Student Board.
There is also some money left for organizational expenses, we hope this can be used for some kind of demonstration or action during the fall.

## 2035 Elections and appointments

### 2035.1 Election of 3 main and 4 substitute representatives to the Learing Environment Committee (LMU)

Case responsible: The Student Board

## Purpose:

To elect 3 main representatives and 4 substitutes to the Learning Environment Committee.

## Background:

The Learning Environment Committee shall contribute to a good study and learning environment at the University, and to ensure that the physical and mental learning and work environment is fully justified on the basis of an overall assessment of the students' health, safety and welfare, cf. Section 4-3 of the University - and the College Act. The learning environment includes all factors that affect student well-being and that are within the NMBU's area of responsibility, except for the academic study program. It also includes student welfare and student social conditions at the learning site.

The Learning Environment Committee (LMU) shall contribute to the University Board being able to fulfill its overall responsibility. LMU has delegated authority from the University Board to make decisions in matters concerning the learning environment and which are not of a strategic overall nature. The students are represented with half of the committee members, four out of eight members. From the summer of 2020, three of the student representatives will be elected by the Student Parliament, and the last representative will be from the Student Board.

The Learning Environment Committee has at least two meetings in the semester, where, among other things, they advise to the University Board how the Board should allocate 3.6 million, which is earmarked for major LMU measures. LMU also adopts the distribution of smaller learning environment measures, works with action plans, and follows up reports such as the SHOT survey.

# 2035.2 Election of the Control Committee <br> Case responsible: Election Committee 

## Purpose:

To elect 2 members to the control committee. This position lasts one year and goes into effect immediately upon election.

## Background:

The control committee is to be an advisory organ that is required to report to the Student Parliament if there is a breach of the statutes, regulations, or rules of procedure. The committee is required to attend the Student Parliament - at least two members must be present, and one must be a part of the counting committee at the meeting.

## Candidates:

There are no preannounced candidates.
The Student Board suggests that the election for the control committee was pushed to the next Student Parliament. It is best that the Student Parliament decides for themselves who shall be controlling them for the next year.

## Decision:

The Student Parliament decided to push the election of the control committee to the next student parliament.

### 2035.3 Election of student representatives to the SiÅs Board Case responsible: Election Committee

## Purpose:

The two main representatives hold the position for 2 years, while the two deputies hold their position for one year. The position goes into effect on July 1, 2020.

## Background:

The Student Welfare Association of Ås (SiÅs) has the responsibility of taking up the interests of students at Campus Ås. They have, amongst other things, been in support of the building or Eika, and now they are working on new student housing. The SiÅs board is the association's highest board, and has responsibility for the overall operations, both strategically and economically. Students make up the majority of the board, and they have the president and vice president positions. The other committee members consist of one of the employees from SiÅs, one from NMBU, and one external representative. The committee governs itself.

### 2035.4 Election to the University's Research Committee <br> Case responsible: Election Committee

## Purpose:

To elect one main representative and two deputy representative to the Research Committee. The position lasts one year and goes into effect on July 1, 2020.

## Background:

The Research Committee is NMBU's research policy organ and advises and gives strategic input to the University Board and the Dean in cases concerning research and research dissemination. The committee also handles cases delegated to them by the University Board. The committee has about eight meetings evenly spaced throughout the year.

The Student Board: 1 main representative and 2 substitute candidates shall be elected. The main representative sits together with one representative from the Student Board.

The Student Board suggested that the Student Board supplement the substitutes for this election since there are no substitutes presented for this meeting.

### 2035.5 Election of Chairmen

Case responsible: Election Committee

## Purpose:

To elect two chairmen and two substitutes. Effective immediately upon election, the position lasts until the Student Parliament 3 on April 21 ${ }^{\text {st }} 2021$.

## Background:

The main responsibility of the chairmen is to ensure that the Student Parliament goes through the planned agenda in an orderly fashion, and within a reasonable amount of time. The chairmen should have experience in leading meetings and should preferably have been a part of bigger meetings or many previous Student Parliaments. Normally the chairmen have a meeting with the president and vice president of the Student Board where they go over the agenda and make a time management plan. It is important that the chairmen follow regulated meeting practices, and it is therefore important that they are well-versed in this. The position gives both experience with structured meeting leadership and good insight into the Student Democracy's work here at NMBU.
