We observe in the media that people are irritable. (Luckily not to the same level as in the US where the country experiences break-ins to city halls or similar with armed persons.)

The answer is short and does not provide comfort: **no one knows**. We saw this when the revised national budget was presented yesterday.

With the postponed move for the Faculty of Veterinary Science, NMBU has even more to struggle through than the other Norwegian universities. In addition, we have fairly intensive laboratory and field work as central components in many of our degree programs. Our numerous international students are experiencing an especially trying time because the crisis package did not include them and because they are far away from home in an insecure time. We in the university leadership are doing all we can to alleviate the situation for all groups.

I would like to thank each and every one of you, students as well as staff, who have done everything possible to find ways to adapt daily life in this difficult time, exhibited the willingness to change, continued working – even though it has been hard – and tolerated he situation we are now in. I firmly believe that our strong will, cooperation and solidarity is getting us through this.

Corona situation: focus on knowledge!

A little on the academic side of the corona situation. Among our core tasks as a university, it is education that has suffered the most during the corona crisis, namely the students and the administration of studies. We have also had extra focus on students who are completing their studies this year, and the doctoral and postdoctoral candidates who have been caught in tight timeframe without room for disruptions.
