- in the Student Parliament, and therefore the Chairmen have had an important role when it is
- 231 unclear if the Student Parliament is following the regulations and protocol. It is still important
- that the Chairmen follow regulated meeting practices, and it is therefore important that they
- are well-versed in this. To work as a Chairman is interesting and enriching. The position gives
- both experience with structured meeting leadership and a good insight into the Student
 Democracy's work here at NMBU.
