

EXTENDED GRANT PERIOD 2021

Funded by the Horizon 2020 Framework programme of the European Union around 120.000€/Y, in total 480.000€ from October 2019 to September 2023.


The budget is confirmed based on the achievement of the deliverables **every six months**.
