1. Your points of contact

The EU-office is in charge of all Erasmus students coming to the University of Freiburg and provides
the infrastructure for your registration and application process through the Mobility-Online Portal.
Through the portal, you can also apply for housing. This is their website (useful information about
matriculation etc.)

2. Application deadlines

Our central Erasmus office will send you a link for registering in the Mobility Online Portal of the University of Freiburg.

Deadlines for registration:

For the winter semester: June 15 For the summer semester: January 15

Kindly be aware that you have to apply two times, both for the winter and summer semester, if you wish to stay for the entire academic year.

Once you are registered, the Mobility Online Portal will guide you through the application process.

3. Lecture periods

Winter Semester: 17.10.2021 - 11.2.2022 (Bachelor)

17.10.2021 - 04.03.2022 (Master)

Summer Semester: 25.04.2022 - 30.07.2022 (Bachelor)

18.04.2022 - 30.07.2022 (Master)

4. Courses

Bachelor students can only choose courses from our Bachelor programmes and have no access to the courses of our Master programmes. Exception: If students are enrolled in a 4/5-year Bachelor/undergraduate programme and do their Erasmus exchange in their 4th year, they are allowed to take Master courses.

At the time when you have to fill in your learning agreement, the course catalogues for the semester of your stay in Freiburg are not published yet. To fill in the learning agreement we therefore recommend using the course catalogues from the year before and making a provisional choice. The catalogues for the coming fall semester will be published only in August.

A few weeks before the semester starts we will send you the link to the up-to-date course catalogue and ask you to check and confirm their selection. We will then try to book you into the courses. It can happen that a course is already fully booked with regular students. In this case, we will offer alternatives. The learning agreement can be changed within 4 weeks after arrival in Freiburg.

5. Language requirements

All our Bachelor courses are taught in German. To be accepted students need a German level of B2.

In our **Master** programmes, we have modules taught in German and English. Depending on the choice of modules Erasmus students have to submit a language proof in German or/and English with a minimum **B2 level**. Our regular Master students have to prove a C1 level.

Our master courses are organised as a sequence of 3 weeks blocks with exams at the end of each block. This implies that students cannot develop their language skills throughout the semester, but have to be able to understand and to communicate right from the beginning.

6. Housing

After the registration, students can apply online for <u>housing</u> in a student residence. If Erasmus students apply right away it is very likely that they get a place.

7. German Language Courses

The University of Freiburg offers German courses free of cost <u>for Erasmus students</u>. The courses take place once or twice a week. You will be informed about registration procedures once you registered in the Mobility Online portal.

If you want to learn or improve your German before the semester starts you can book a place in a 4-week-intensive course offered by the Language Institute of our University (SLI). Please note, that these courses are very popular and have to be booked early in the year.
