Group 1

WG1 Glossary and Taxonomy focuses on a comprehensive overview of new working spaces (NeWSp) in Europe and outside.

The WG1 members have finalized D.1.3. Database of WG1 findings: typologies and location patterns of new working spaces; D.1.4. Summary report of WG1 findings: Typologies and location patterns of NeWSps, which belong to the tasks of the second grant period (Task 1.3 Geographical distribution and location patterns with a specific focus on peripheral areas).

The deliverables will be evaluated soon by external reviewers as required by the COST Action.

Working Group 2

WG2 Atlas focuses on the development of an 'Atlas' of best practices about new working spaces concerning the effects of the such workplaces and workers performance (direct effects), and the built environment (indirect effects): Task 2.1. Collection of studies, data and practices about the direct effects of new working spaces (direct effects) and Task 2.2. Collection of studies, data and practices about the indirect effects on the urban socio-economic environment with a specific focus on peripheral areas.

WG2 is currently on

- mapping the data collected by the COST members in previous and current studies
- finalizing the COST Working paper -What happens to your country during COVID-19?

This is a cross-country collection of narrations and evidence considering the immediate effects of the Covid-19 pandemic on NeWSp; what we know from reading of newspapers, blogs and other social media, as well as national and local measures.

17 Countries are contributing: Estonia, France, Germany, Ireland, Norway, Portugal, Netherlands, Switzerland, Czech Republic, Greece, Italy, Malta, Republic of North Macedonia, Romania, Slovakia, USA, and Lebanon.









Group 3

WG3 Tool Box focuses on the Collection of the policy tools that have been implemented at national, regional and local levels, and their effects on new working spaces. This knowledge will allow to develop a tool box containing strengths and weaknesses related to the activation and non activation of policy tools. (see task 3.1, 3.2 and 3.3 of the Memorandum of Understanding)

The WG3 has launched a survey on NeWSps related policies and guidelines. The aim is to collect information on policies to work on a comparative assessment of practices and provide recommendations towards a common European framework for promoting NeWSps. 10 countries: the Czech Republic, Estonia, France, Germany, Italy, Malta, Portugal, Romania, the United Kingdom, and the USA, have answered to the survey.

Working Group 4

WG4 Dissemination focuses on the dissemination of the main results of the COST Action CA18214 which concerns the following tasks: Task 4.1 is dedicated to the dissemination of the results that will be presented in national and international scientific conferences, refereed journal articles and reports, and through videos and podcasts. Task 4.2 focuses on knowledge transfer at all levels, including the possibility for science education and training. In particular, through a mix of face-to-face events (interviews, meetings and workshops) the objective is to empower stakeholders and academics.

WG4 is currently developing multimedia contents (videos coordinated by Chiara Tagliaro and podcasts coordinated by Emannuel Costa), as well as iv) networking sites for scientists and researchers (such as Research Gate).

Since October 2019, the Science Communication Manager is monitoring the dissemination activies and publications, organizations of conferences, roundtables and special sessions, as well as new research projects, which are based on networks among the COST members.
