It is about seeing the big picture and about prioritizing and making choices for how 65 NMBU will be able to realize our goals as an institution. It can be said that the strategy amplifies the 66 university's long-term goals. This is the most important management document at NMBU. 67 The leader of AU is a member of the steering group (ULT) and the working group for the strategy. The 68 Student Parliament and the student councils will be involved in the form of input gatherings and 69 hearings in the coming semester. The Rector has decided that the new strategy will enter into force 70 from 1.1.2023, and last until 2030, seen in connection with the UN's sustainability goals.

- 97 The representatives in all the boards start at 01.07.2022 and poses the position for one (1) year. 98

99 The Student Board:

100 The Student Board is the Student Democracy's highest organ between Student Parliament meetings.

101 They carry out the daily tasks of the Student Democracy and follow up on decisions made by the

102 Student Parliament. The Student Board prepares case papers for the Student Parliament. The Student

103 Board shall consists of 3 members: president and 2 board members, in full time (100%) positions. The

104 members of AU are redeemed from their studies. The Student Board is a "collective" board, which

means that all members are equal within the board. The Student Board also has an organizational
 secretary who works organizational and administratively.

107

108 The president has responsibility for strategic matters and represents NMBU students in the highest 109 levels of leadership at NMBU, SiÅs Ås Municipality and other external offices. The president also has the 110 responsibility for interacting with the media and the overarching responsibility of the organization. The 111 other members allocate the areas and tasks between them, the area of responsibilities includes Study 112 quality, learning environment, internationalization, student welfare, equality and diversity, research 113 and sustainability at NMBU. The two members also work with the organizational matters in the 114 organization and work closely with and follow up the other elected representatives in the Student 115 Democracy to ensure good training and information flow within the organization.

116

We strongly recommend that the students that wants to run for the positions within the Student Board
have knowledge of organizational work from before, as well as organizational and political experience.
Furthermore, there is a strength to have cooperated closely in a team before and be a team player.

122 **The University Board**:

123 The University Board at NMBU is the highest decision-making organ at NMBU and consists of an 124 external committee leader, and committee members that are both internal and external to NMBU.

125

126 The University Board works mostly with strategic matters, budgets, goal setting, reporting, and

127 organizational development at an overarching level. The University Board has 7-8 meetings per year.

128 Apart from this, members should meet up for other high-level meetings and seminars arranged by the

129 "Kollegieforumet", which is a cooperation of boardmebmer for other universities and colleges; that

130 concern the work of the board. The Committee members must also report their work to the Student

131 Parliament and are obligated to be represented during parliament meetings.

- 132 From students, there should be two main representatives and two substitutes for the University Board.
- 133 In accordance with regulations there needs to be an equal gender representation, and it has been
- 134 decided that women are elected in the spring and men in the autumn.
- 135 We strongly recommend that students who wish to run for the University Board should have
- experience in committees (SiÅs Board, institute committees, faculty committees, or similar) or board
 work experience at a higher level (UFU/USU).
- 138 These positions are remunerated.
- 139

140 **The Faculty Boards**:

141 The Faculty Board is the faculties' highest decision making organ, and consists of scientific employees,

- 142 external board members and two student representatives. They work on cases of strategic character on
- faculty level , and work with similar cases as the University Board. The Board has the overarching
 responsibility locally, and their most important tasks are strategy, and action plans, as well as budget
- and accounting. They have approximately four meetings a year that last for 6 hours each.
- 146 There are seven Faculty Board at NMBU, and they have similar practices with some local differences.
- 147 Just like the University Board there needs to be equal gender representation, and women are elected in148 the spring and men in the autumn.
- 149 The board member are obligated to attend the Student Council meetings and report back to their
- 150 Faculty, and to inform the Student Council about decisions that are made in the Faculty Board.

- The representatives in all the boards are elected by electronic vote (Student Elections), start July 1st
 2022, and sit for a period of one year.

Last autumn, Ås bought a leisure property by Årungen, named Kinnsåsen, from Tine SA in 2021 to
secure the area for the public and that all residents of Ås can enjoy this property. The municipality has
contacted AU where they ask for inputs regarding the operating model of Kinnsåsen, in order to map
what makes it attractive for NMBU students to use the property.

- The cabin at Kinnsåsen was built in the 1960s and has 18 beds, kitchen facilities, toilet and shower. For
 many years it has been possible to rent the cabin as a party place or for other events, which the
 municipality still has a positive opinion about.
- 192 The property is regulated as a free area / park and is located within the natural environment
- 193 consideration zone in the area part of the municipal plan. The municipal director has sent an
- application for state securing of the area. A state secured outdoor area is an outdoor area that is
- considered important to the public. The purpose of state securing is to secure areas as publicly
- accessible outdoor living areas for current and future generations.

274 275 276 277 278 279	Background: Based on a new structure for the Student Board (AU), where three people who work full time and have been permitted from studies, AU is vulnerable if one of the members should, against all odds, resign from position. According to current regulation, a new electronic urn election must be arranged if a member resigns. It is time consuming and administratively difficult to arrange such a supplementary election in the middle of a semester, especially if you have already lost a member. Furthermore, it will		

- also be catastrophic for the day-to-day operations if you lose a member concerning the areas ofresponsibility within the AU.
- Therefore, AU wants to add a paragraph to the regulations that specify and introduce substitutes to AU,
- and their function. This is to ensure continuity in AU if something should happen to one of the members
- and also have a guarantee that the organization will be more robust. The substitutes will be decided
- based on the candidates who run for the positions during the electronic urn election, where those with
- the highest number of votes (after those who win the election) get the substitute positions.
- The substitutes will have a support function, and a sparring-partner for the members of the Student Board. The substitutes will not get permit from their studies but will be remunerated if they must step in for one of the members in certain situations. The substitutes will also be members of AU on equal terms, which means that they will be able to attend AU meetings, gain access to case documents, participate in kick-off seminars and class representatives training, and assist in the work to the extent
- that they can take over the position if something was going to happen.

- Purpose: The purpose of this case paper is to discuss the implications of having a Norwegian language
 requirement to participate in the Student Board as proposed by AU. Furthermore, the purpose is to
 discuss the inclusion of international students in the student parliament, and the consequences of using
 Norwegian as the leading language. Based on this discussion we aim to bring forward both a resolution
- 314 case and a statute change case for the next Student Parliament.
- **Background:** In the first Student Parliament meeting of 2022, the discussion case about B2 Norwegian
- as a requirement for students to run for the Student Board (Arbeidsutvalget, AU) was on the agenda.
- Below are some of the arguments presented for implementing this language requirement and the
- 318 counter-arguments against.
- The leader and deputy leader of the Student Board argue in their letter (attachment 4) that requiring a
- 320 B2 Norwegian level will not restrict diversity or limit international participation in the Student
- 321 Democracy. Further, this language requirement is argued to make the student democracy more cost-
- 322 effective because there are less practical constraints by not having to translate discussions and
- documents. It is also argued to make discussions more fruitful because students can express themselves
- in their first language. Finally, the language law has been used as an argument in favor of implementing
- this language requirement. This argument is being made on questionable grounds, and seems to be
- 326 missing the purpose of the law.

- 327 However, the international student community at NMBU have highlighted that this change and the
- above arguments are highly problematic (not least in the letter published by ISU NMBU, see attachment
- 329 3). We aim to deepen democracy at NMBU by fully including the international students in the Student
- 330 Democracy.
- Any Norwegian language requirement, including a B2 Language requirement, for the Student Board
 members will exclude international students from full participation. The Student Democracy is for all
 students at NMBU. All students should have the same rights of participation in this organization. Setting
 any Norwegian language requirement would go against the Student Democracy's own values of seeing
 every single student at NMBU as an equal member of the community.
- 555 every single student at NMBO as an equal member of the community.
- The leader and deputy leader of the Student Board argue that requiring a B2 Norwegian level will not
- 337 "restrict diversity" or limit international participation in the Student Democracy. This is wrong. Even
- 338 without this requirement, it is already difficult to fully participate, and international students have at
- times felt unwelcome. The Norwegian language requirement would only worsen this issue by further
- 340 restricting access to, and participation in, the student democracy.
- 341 NMBU does not offer sufficient Norwegian language courses, meaning that international students who
- 342 want to learn the language must look elsewhere, travel, and pay a great deal of money. This means that
- 343 implementing a Norwegian language requirement would put a financial barrier on the participation of
- 344 non-Norwegian speaking students.
- However, this is an issue of principle concerned with discrimination. NMBU is an international
- 346 university with full degree English speaking students and staff. International students are equal and full
- 347 members of the NMBU demos. It should not be required to know the Norwegian language in order to
- 348 participate in the Student Democracy at an *international* university. We would also like to point toward 349 the Norwagian anti-discriminatory law which includes discrimination based on language[1]
- the Norwegian anti-discriminatory law, which includes discrimination based on language[1].
- 350 *The leading language in the Student Parliament should be English.* This way all the students of NMBU can
- actively and equally participate in the important discussions that take place. The 'translator solution'
 that is in place now is not sufficient. This only allows non-Norwegian speakers to passively follow what
- 353 is being said, and limits to a great extent their possibility to engage actively and equally in the
- 354 discussions.
- A valid point can be made that discussions in English might not be of the quality that is wished for, due
- 356 to non-native speakers feeling uncomfortable speaking in English and not having all the needed words
- in their vocabulary. This is also true of many international students who do not have English as their
- 358 first language. English is the only language all students at NMBU have in common and that is the most
- important consideration.
- 360 In the original discussion case, a B2 Norwegian level is said to be sufficient for a work environment in
- the Student Board, in this case a B2 English level should be sufficient for working in the Student
- Barliament. The extra effort one may need to put in is heavily outweighed by the inclusiveness and
- democracy that will come from having English as the leading language.
- The Student Parliament cannot call itself a democracy (folkestyre) while excluding an entire category of
 students from active participation from the outset. Therefore, it is worth considering whether English
 should be the leading language in order to have a full and inclusive Student Parliament.

Cases where students feel unfairly treated appear now and then. It can be about administrative decisions, examination procedures, censorship, assessment system and teaching. NMBU should aim for a zero vision for this. All rules are in NMBU's regulations or are authorized there. Unfortunately, the regulations are both difficult to find and appears as confusing. It is also unreasonable to demand that individual students should be able to interpret heavy legal texts on their own. There is a great need for making the laws and regulations that apply to NMBU's students available to ensure students' legal security. This must also happen through increased competence and training.

899 During the corona pandemic, many students noticed the importance of predictability in their studies. 900 When an exam is moved all sudden, it has a big impact on our everyday lives. Maybe that means you 901 must drop a block course or take twice as many credits as planned? Hopefully, temporary corona 902 regulations will be history after 2022 but we must learn from what has happened. For example, we 903 have learned that practicing for an approved / not approved exam is something completely different 904 than practicing for an exam with an exam grade. In addition, we have learned that it was not always 905 given sufficient information about what it took to pass the exam. The regulations of the NMBU follow 906 the legal method, which means that they are formulated in a way that can be a bit difficult to 907 understand. It is therefore not necessarily the regulations themselves that are the source of the 908 problems. Much can be done with the routines at NMBU to improve legal certainty. An example of this 909 could be to include training on the democratic processes at NMBU as a common compulsory course.

- 910 Education as well as proper educating must be followed up.
- 911 Having knowledge of the rules that affect your everyday should not be a special skill only some students
- 912 have. Of course, not all students need to have a full overview of all the regulations at NMBU, but work
- 913 must be done to ensure that everyone has a general knowledge of them and where you can find them.
- Although some of the responsibility for knowing the regulations must be given to the students, a
- 915 significant part must also be given to the university. Course responsible people, lecturers, program
- 916 councils, supervisors, etc. are in a position where one single resolution they make can have a great
- 917 impact on the students' everyday lives and negatively affect the study progression. Therefore, efforts
- 918 should be made to train both students and staff so that students will get better legal security.

920 The Student Parliament at NMBU demands that:

- NMBU shall, in collaboration with the Student Board, work to ensure that the rules in NMBU's regulations are clear and easy for students to find and understand.
- The university will work to ensure that employees gain better knowledge of NMBU's regulations.
- NMBU shall systematically review its routines so that students will have legal certainty at all levels.
- Efforts will be made to increase transparency around the processes that results in a resolution.

- Students must have very good predictability for both the examination and the assessment system.

 The information presented about NMBU's regulations will be more user-friendly, focusing on the students.

- I am writing this open letter today on behalf of NMBU's International Student Union (ISU) and with the support of ESN and SAIH. It has come to our attention that the Student Board of NMBU plans to introduce a requirement that all future applicants to the board be proficient in the Norwegian

- 1035 and the credibility of the student board with regard o integration of international students.
- 1036 NMBU has a comprehensive international environment and welcomes international students from all
 1037 over the world. Approximately 12% of current students at the university have travelled from abroad,
 1038 while 8% of staff have foreign citizenship. Moreover, 43% of study programmes at NMBU are in
- 1039 English and over half (56%) of the masters' degree students are international students. These figures
- alone are testament to the negative effects this adjustment to the statutes of the student democracy
- 1041 will have on internationalisation and diversity within the student board.
- We believe that this case is a backwards step for the internationalization of the university andthat there should be no exclusion for non-Norwegian speakers. Moreover, we hold that future international officers on the student board should have great experience of what it means to be an international student and the difficulties that come with that. International students already feel left aside in a foreign country and introducing a requirement to be proficient in Norwegian to run for positions within the student board will exclude them even more from university life. Having candidates from many different backgrounds enriches diversity and democracy on campus.

1058 First of all the student board want to thank you for participating in this debate, and voicing your 1059 opinions. It is through discussion and debate we get everyone's viewpoint, and really can see the 1060 positive effect of internationalization and inclusion. Together we hope to continue this work. 1061 To clarify, if anyone should be uncertain about some facts on the case, it will in the end be the Student 1062 Parliament who will decide on this case, along with a lot of other changes to the Student Parliament by-1063 laws. It is true that we will send a suggestion to them based on the discussion-case mentioned, number 1064 2214.1. The suggestion and case-papers for the Student Parliament will be made public Thursday 24th 1065 of February. 1066

1067 Now it is important to note that we are bound by some rules and regulations that we have no direct 1068 control over. The main issue here is the Norwegian language law (commonly referred to in Norwegian 1069 as "Språklova"), and the language political document of NMBU. The combination of these binding 1070 documents results in a vast amount of documents only being available in Norwegian, which in turn 1071 results in some discussions being more fruitful and efficient in Norwegian. This might at first glance 1072 seem like a minor issue, and in most cases it is. The exception is when one is elected to work fulltime in 1073 the position as Student Board member or leader. Only once in the history of student democracy have an 1074 English-speaking student managed this. The dedication, motivation, accommodation and work required 1075 is tremendous. The Student Board is working for the 6750 students attending NMBU. The workload of 1076 this is huge, even for students fluent in Norwegian.

1077 1078 For future Student Boards to be able to focus on all the things that can be done to improve student life 1079 we feel this change is necessary. We have no intention of barring the door for international students to 1080 participate in the Student Democracy, in the student life or the student culture. It simply a language 1081 requirement, which is common in a workplace environment. We do believe that this will not restrict 1082 diversity more than it will benefit all students. The voices and opinions of international students will 1083 still be heard in meetings with you, the international organisations at NMBU. It will be heard from the 1084 student representatives in the Student Parliament, from representatives in the Student Councils. And it 1085 will be listened to by the international responsible and all other members of the Student Board.

1315 **Purpose of the instruction**:

This instruction provides an overall insight into the student councils' purpose, function and organization, and shall contribute to them being run equally across the faculties. It is indicative, and each faculty can adapt it to the local conditions. However, it is strongly encouraged that you follow it as closely as possible. The instruction shall be used in the training of new class representatives after the general meetings. The president and vice-president of each faculty are responsible for following up the instructions.

1322 The Student Council's vision:

1323The Student Council's primary task is to organize the class representatives at the faculty level and1324safeguard the students' rights and interests at the faculty. The Student Council is an arena for1325communication and cooperation between class representatives in various councils / committees and1326across fields of study. The Student Council shall contribute to good communication between the1327students and staff at its faculty.

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The Student Council's main tasks:

- Be an arena for discussion about local and central issues concerning the students at the faculty.
- To promote the students' interests in all relevant councils and committees at the faculty.
- All members of the student council are responsible for informing the student council about
- important matters that are discussed in their councils / committees if there is no exemption fromthe duty of confidentiality.
- Discuss issues that are promoted by the students at the faculty and promote them in the relevant
 council / committee.
- Communicate important information about current issues to the students at the faculty.
- The student councils will discuss student affairs and stay up to date on what is happening in the
 Student Democracy in general.
- In collaboration with the Student Parliament's Student Board (AU), ensure that new class
 representatives are introduced to work tasks and current issues in their new position.
- 1343 The Student Council and AU are responsible for ensuring that all members of the Student Council
 1344 agree with these instructions, as well as other documents that are central to the performance of
 1345 their duties.
- 1346 The Student Council shall follow up the adopted Annual Wheel and Date Plan for the Student
 1347 Parliament and set up its activities based on these.
- Conduct a faculty general meeting once a semester.
- The Student Council shall contribute to the Student Council in particular, and the Student
 Democracy in general being visible on campus, especially during the buddy week.
- The Student Council shall also be a social meeting place and is responsible for stimulating
 academic community for students at the faculty. Where relevant, the student council has the overall
 responsibility for academic homes.

1354 **Composition of the Student Council:**

- **President.** Elected for 1 year at the autumn meeting.
- **Vice-president.** Elected for 1 year at the spring general meeting.
- **Student Parliament representatives.** Elected for 1 year at the autumn meeting.
- Faculty board representatives. Elected for 1 year in electronic urn election in the autumn (male)
 and spring (female).
- Student representatives in the faculty's research committee. Elected for 1 year at a general meeting.
- Student representatives in the faculty's teaching committee / study committee. Elected for 1 year at a
 general meeting
- Student representatives in the faculty's recommendation committee. Elected for 1 year at a general
 meeting
- Student representatives in the faculty's recruitment committee. Elected for 1 year at a general
 meeting
- **Program Council representatives.** How they are chosen and how long they sit varies from faculty to faculty.

Class representatives from all classes. Elected in principle for the entire study program at STUD100
 in the August block. Possibly other representatives, for example from the programme associations or
 temporary working groups.

- **1372 Tasks for all members of the student council:**

- Order rooms, food and drinks for the student council meetings.
- Overall responsibility for the promotion of the Student Council. Sits in the working group for the
 promotion of Student Democracy.
- More specific information in "Instructions for the president and vice-president of the student council".
- 1408 <u>Student Parliament representatives</u>
- Has a duty to attend student meetings (3 meetings per semester) and meets as a representative from
 his faculty.
- To promote the Student Council's opinions at the Student Parliament.
- Responsible for student affairs at the Student Council. It is encouraged that the ST representatives are the case presenters on these cases.
- Attend the student council dinner
- Participates in the Kickoff Conference in January-February.
- 1416 <u>Faculty Board Representatives (FS)</u> The Faculty Board is the faculty's highest organ. The faculty board is
 1417 responsible for setting overall goals, priorities and strategies for the faculty.
- Has a duty to attend faculty board meetings (2 meetings per semester). Is responsible for calling in a substitute if they cannot attend.
- 1420 Promotes students' opinions and views on issues that are discussed in FS.

• Informs the student council about important matters that are not covered by confidentiality.

- 1423 <u>Representatives in the Faculty's study committee / teaching committee (SU / UU)</u>
- Has a duty to attend meetings in SU / UU (approx. 3-5 meetings in the semester). Is responsible for calling in a substitute if they cannot attend.
- 1426 Promotes students' opinions and views on matters dealt with in (SU / UU).
- Addresses issues in SU that are raised in the student council or by individual students.
- Has a duty to report to the student council.

- 1430 <u>Representatives in the Faculty's Research Committee (FU)</u>
- Has a duty to attend meetings in FU (approx. 3-5 meetings in the semester). Is responsible for calling in a substitute if they cannot attend.

- Addresses issues in FU that are raised in the student council or by individual students.
- Has a duty to report to the student council.

1437 <u>Representatives in the Faculty's recommendation committee</u> - The recommendation committee

1486	Knowledge from children
1487	All children in Norway have knowledge about their experience from the system or service they are in
1488	and how they work. The Changefactory conducts systematic surveys for children from all over Norway.
1489	They collect experiences and advice from children about their meeting with kindergartens, schools,
1490	emergency services and the legal system. The answers that are repeated are summarized and collected
1491	as knowledge directly from children. The goal is that this knowledge is included when the systems are
1492	further developed, so that the systems made for children will be experienced as safe and useful for
1493	them. Knowledge from children contains descriptions of how kindergarten teachers, teachers, health
1494	workers, child welfare workers and others who meet children should be, for children to get sufficient
1495	learning and get good help. This knowledge describes how adults must act to make it safe for the
1496	children to talk openly about important things. The perspectives presented are based solely on
1497	experiences and advice from children who are in various systems and services.
1498	
1499	The Convention on the Rights of the Child states that all children have four basic rights when you meet
1500	them, when actions are to be taken and decisions are made that will affect them.
1501	
1502	- that the best interests of the child should be a fundamental consideration in all actions that affect
1503	children (BK article 3, Constitution §104),
1504	- that the child has the right to express himself/herself freely about matters that affect the child (BK
1505	article 12, Constitution § 104)
1506	- that the child has the right to get information in connection with the child having the right to express
1507	himself or herself (BK Article 12),
1508	- and that the child has the right to privacy (BK article 16, The European
1509	Human Rights Convention (ECHR) Article 8, Constitution § 102).
1510	
1511	The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child contains some basic procedural rights that apply to
1512	everyone under the age of 18. By systematically teaching students how to use these rights in practice
1513	can have great significance in the lives of many children. The rights protect children's legal certainty,
1514	and studies show that if the rights are followed in all circumstances that affects a child, the trust of the
1515	adults working in the services is maintained. This will not only contribute to the children gained
1516	confidence in the professionals of the future, but also give the students concrete tools they can use
1517	when they start working. Then we ensure that they follow Norwegian law. For the future students that
1518	will work with children, to be well equipped to meet this community group in their working life, it is
1519	crucial that NMBU systematically trains
1520	their students in what children themselves believe are good ways to be met in all systems and services
1521	which is made for them.
1522	
1523	The Student Parliament at NMBU believes that:
1524	• NMBU will become a children's rights university with focus on children's basic procedural rights
1525	according to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, in all fields of study that educate students to
1526	work with children.

- Work to ensure that foreign-language international students are included in all councils and committees at NMBU.
- Collaborate with SAIH on a campaign to highlight international issues and the creation of a new subject around Scholars at Risk.
- A workshop will be arranged with the Student Society and UKA to share good inclusion measures that
 can be used for inclusive events, and to build a supportive cross-culture in the student community.

- Work to improve the traffic situation in Ås, primarily campus, with a focus on improved public

1658 **Chapter 2: Structure of the Student Democracy at NMBU**

1659 § 2-1 At a Central Level

The highest democratic organ in the Student Democracy at NMBU is the Student Parliament. The daily
operations of the Student Parliament are carried out by the Student Parliament's Student Board.

1663 § 2-2 At a Faculty Level

At the Faculty level, the Student Democracy consists of Student Councils. Student Councils are
constructed of the committees and positions that come from the model for Student Councils approved
of at Student Parliament 6 on 14.11.2016.

1667

The Faculty general assembly is the highest student democracy organ at a faculty level. Between faculty
general assemblies the student councils stand for the daily operations and representations of the
faculty's student democracy.

- 1672 The Student Council at Campus Adamstuen is delegated the power of communication and 1673 representation over the Welfare Committee in Oslo and Akershus.

1675 Chapter 3:The Student Parliament

1676 § 3-1 Powers and Functions

- 1677 The Student Parliament represents all students at NMBU, and decisions made in the Student Parliament
- are made on the behalf of all students. The Student Parliament has the responsibility to inform about
- 1679 decisions made. Closing of the meeting must follow the provisions in §3-6.

1680 § 3-2 Construction

- 1681 The Faculties at NMBU are constituents of the Student Parliament. The Student Parliament consists of
- 1682 25 representatives. These representatives are distributed according to the democracy model approved 1683 of at Student Parliament 6 in 2016.
- 1684 The division method for the mandatory seat allocation follows this formula:

- 1692 Updated number of students can be found in the Database for Statistics on Higher Education (DBH)
 1693 every fall. The average of the number of students for the spring semester and fall semester make up the
 1694 basis for the following year's representative distribution in the Student Parliament.
 1695
- 1696 This calculation basis is presented for orientation before the fall faculty general assemblies.

1697 1698 **§ 3-3 Constituting**

The Student Parliament representatives are elected for one year at the time. One should aim for the
constituent Student Parliament to be held between the fall faculty general assemblies and the new year.

1702 § 3-4 Meetings and Summoning

- The Student Parliament must hold at least 3 meetings per semester. The Student Board is responsible
 for summoning the Student Parliament. Summoning and case papers should be made available to all
 students at least 7 days before the meeting. Electronic decisions are the exclusion of this statute cf. §310.

- The provision that the summoning and case papers need to be made available for all students in the
 first paragraph entails that they need to be translated to English. If there is uncertainty about the
 translation, the Norwegian version will be the basis for understanding. Further specification is outlined
 in the instructions for the Student Parliament.

- All students with a valid semester registration have the right to send in cases to the Student Parliament.
 This must be done at the latest 14 days before the meeting if the case is to be handled. This provision
 does not count for cases to be handled under "other." Further specification is outlined in the
 instructions for the Student Parliament. Extraordinary Student Parliaments is held if at least 3 members
 of the Student Board, at leas 13 representatives from the Student Parliament, or at least 25 students
 desire it. Extraordinary Student Parliament is to be made known to the public at least 7 days before
 taking place, and should only handle the case(s) that were the reason for its summoning.

1721 § 3-5 Representation at the

- 1722 Representation at the Student Parliament
- 1723 The following people are required to attend Student Parliament, and are required to give a written1724 notification before the meeting if they cannot attend:
- 1725 The Student Parliament's Representatives
- 1726 The Student Parliament's Student Board
- 1727 The Student Parliament's organizational secretary
- 1728 The Student Parliament's chairmen 1729

1730 At least one representative from the following organs must attend the meeting:

- 1731 The Student Representative in the University Board
- 1732 The Student Representative in the SiÅs board
- 1733 The International Student Union (ISU)
- 1734 The Control Committee

All students at NMBU have the right to attend the Student Parliament.

1737 § 3-6 Closing of a Meeting.

- 1738 The Student Parliament's meetings are open. The Student Parliament can decide to close a meeting with 1739 a qualified majority from the representatives in attendance
- With the closing of a meeting, separate minutes will be recorded that are withheld from publicdisclosure.
- 1742

1743 § 3-7 Decision Validity

1744 The Student Parliament can make valid decisions when at least 50% of the representatives are in1745 attendance.

17461747 § 3-8 Voting rights and Voting

The Student Parliament's representatives have a voting right. If a main representative notifies of an
absence, their appointed substitute has a voting right when in attendance. Decisions in the Student
Parliament are normally made with a 50% majority. Decisions are made with hand raising, unless one
representative asks for a written voting. With a voting tie, the Student Parliament can take a new vote.
With a continued tie after a second voting, the case can be handled according to the proposed
resolution.

1755 §3-9 Speaking and Proposal Rights

Everybody has a right to speak at Student parliament meetings. All students at NMBU has the right to
propose cases at Student parliament meetings.

1759 § 3-10 Electronic Voting

- Electronic voting can be used to make decisions about single cases. Electronic voting is carried out in
 the method described in the instructions for electronic voting. The deadline to vote electronically is
 within 7 days.
- 1764 Electronic voting cannot be used to vote on matters concerning the following:
- 1765 Elections
- 1766 Cases of mistrust
- 1767 Changing to the Student Parliament's committee documents and instructions
- 1768 Appointment of the student representatives to councils and committees
- 1769 Other matters of considerable nature1770
- Main Student Parliament Representatives have voting rights with electronic voting.
- 1773 Electronic voting cannot take place if one or some student parliament representatives wish to handle
 1774 the case at a normal student parliament before the deadline. The desire must be justified.
 1775

1776 § 3-11 Position Resignation

- 1777 The Student Parliament representatives automatically resign from their position in the Student1778 Parliament when they are elected to the following organs:
- 1779 The Student Parliament's Student Board
- 1780 The University Board
- 1781 The SiÅs Board
- 1782 The Student Board of the Norwegian Student Organization
- 1783 The Control Committee
- 1784
- Student Parliament representatives also resigns their positions automatically if they switch to another
 Faculty than the one they were elected to represent.
- With position resignation, the position holder's deputy representative automatically inherits the position as a main representative.

1791 Position resignation, a supplementary election will be conducted in accordance with § 5-5

1792

- 1793 §3-12 Temporary Position Resignation
- 1794 In the case of partiality, there will be a temporary place resignation. This means that the representative
- withdraws from their position in cases where it applies. In the case of temporary place resignation thedeputy will take over cf. § 6-1

1797 Chapter 4: The Student Parliament's Student Board

1798 § 4-1 Powers and Functions

1799 The Student Board (AU) carries out the Student Parliament's daily operations and represents the

- 1800 Student Parliament between meetings. AU can make decisions in urgent cases, cases that are delegated
- due to earlier decisions in the Student Parliament, and appoint people to non-decision making
 committees. AU makes proposals in all cases handled by the Student Parliament, with the exception of
- 1803 Elections. 1804

1805 § 4-2 Composition

- 1806 The Student Parliament's Student Board shall consist of the following members:
- 1807 President
- 1808 AU member
- 1809 AU member 1810
- 1811 The Student Board constitutes their areas of responsibility internally.1812
- 1813 Working time and election periods are regulated according to functions § 5-1.1814

1815 § 4-3 Decision Ability and Voting Ties

- 1816 The Student Board can make valid decisions when at least four members are in attendance. With a voting tig in the Student Board, the president has a double vote.
- 1817 voting tie in the Student Board, the president has a double vote.
- 1818

1819 Chapter 5: Elections and Appointments

1820 § 5-1 Eligibility for the Student Democracy

- 1821 The overarching rule is that all Students at NMBU with a valid semester registration can run for 1822 positions in the Student Democracy. This applies unless otherwise specified.

1824 § 5-2 Electronic Ballot Elections

- 1825 <u>a) Election of the Student Parliament's Student Board</u>
- 1826The Student Parliament's Student Board are elected through Electronic Ballot Voting, where all1827students with a valid semester registration have the right to vote. The Electronic Ballot Election take
- place in April every year. They hold their position for 1 year, between 1.7. until 30.6. Candidates who
 apply must be able to master Norwegian as a working language.
- 1830
- 1831 <u>b) Election to the University Board</u>
- 1832 Two student representatives are elected, one of each legal gender, with a deputy. They are chosen
 1833 through an Electronic Ballot vote, where all students with a valid semester registration have the right to
 1834 vote. The election takes place every year in April/May and in November. They hold the position for one
 1835 year, from 01.07 to 30.06 for the spring election, and 01.01-31.12 for the fall election.
- 1837 <u>c) Elections to the Faculty Board</u>
- 1838 Two student representatives, on of each legal gender, are elected with personal substitute to the seven
- 1839 Faculty Boards (FS). These are elected by electronic urn election, where all semester-registered
- students at the relevant faculty have the right to vote. A student only has the right to vote in one faculty
- board election. The Electronic Ballot election takes place every year in April / May and November. The position time for the elected is 1 year and lasts from 01.07 to 20.06 for the environment of 01.01
- 1842 position time for the elected is 1 year and lasts from 01.07. to 30.06 for the spring election, and 01.01-

- 1843 31.12 for the autumn election. Candidates of a gender other than the representative who already sits on
- 1844 the board are eligible to stand for election at a given semester.
- 1845

1846 § 5-3 Members of the Student Board

1847 Members of the Student Parliament's Student Board, other than the president and vice president, are

elected by the Student Parliament. The elections take place at the constituent student parliament. Theyhold the position for one year, between 1.1. until 31.12. The elections are carried out through written

1850 ballot voting and decided with an absolute majority. If none of the candidates receive an absolute

- 1851 majority, a new voting round will be conducted with the two candidates who received the most votes in
- 1852 the first round.
- 1853

1854 § 5-4 Other elections and appointments conducted in the Student Parliament

The Student Parliament elects student representatives to central positions and committees at NMBU, to
individual committees and to the board for student welfare organization. All elections are done by
writing. In the case that only one candidate is running, they can be elected by acclamation, unless at
least one representative wishes to have a written voting process.

With a tie in voting between two candidates, a new voting round will be held. With a continued tie after
a new voting round, the decision will be made according to the proposed resolution. If there is no
suggestion made the decision will be made by drawing lots. Those chosen in this paragraph have
minute requirements to the Student Parliament.

Student Representatives that are not connected to the Student Welfare Organization in Ås (SiÅs) do not
have voting rights for the representatives of The SiÅs Board.

1868 § 5-5 Supplementary Elections

1869 Normally, a supplementary election will be held in the case of place resignation. Supplementary
1870 elections follow the same election rules as normal elections. This can be adjusted in cases of urgent
1871 votes, or other reasons in which it is appropriate.

1872 1873

1874 Chapter 6: Impartiality

1875 § 6-1 Impartiality

For someone to be "partial" entails that there are circumstances that are likely to cause bias in the
person's judgment. This can happen when a person is a part of a case or has strong personal
consequences from the results of a case, or has close family with the previously mentioned.

In order to have good administrative practices, questions of partiality must be strict. This means that a
lot must happen to name a representative partial. Those that are named partial must temporarily resign
from the case, cf.§ 3-12.

1883
1884 Cases of partiality are handled with a 50% majority voting from the relevant organ, and the person in question cannot vote. If more than one person in a case is questioned about partiality, none of the
1886 involved can partake in voting about their own or others' partiality, unless the organ is no longer a
1887 decision making organ in the case. In this case, all meeting members can participate.

1890 Chapter 7: Mistrust

1891 § 7-1 Mistrust

1892 Issues of mistrust can be brought up by Student Parliament representatives or other organs of the

- 1893 Student Democracy, and should be delivered to the Student Parliament's organizational secretary.
- 1894 When handling these issues at the student parliament, the one that the case is brought up against has1895 the opportunity to present their own case.
- 1896

1897 § 7-2 Ability to ask for a statement from the control committee

- 1898 If cases where mistrust are brought forward, both parties can ask for a statement from the control 1899 committee in sufficient time before the case is handled.
- 1900

1901 § 7-3 Issues of mistrust against the representatives chosen by the student parliament

1902 With a 2/3 majority vote amongst representatives in attendance, the student parliament can decide that 1903 an officer is mistrusted, following statutes §§ 5-1 second paragraph, and 5-3. Those who are deemed 1904 distrusted must immediately resign as an appointee from the student parliament

1906 § 7-4 Issues of mistrust against the representatives chosen by Electronic Ballot Voting

1907 With issues of mistrust against representatives chosen through electronic ballot voting after statues §§

1908 5-2 a and b, it is handled first by the Student Parliament. If it is proposed by a qualified majority

- 1909 amongst representatives in attendance, it will be handled through an electronic ballot vote where all 1910 students with a valid semester registration have the right to vote. The approval of the mistrust requires
- 1911 at least a 50% majority of votes. Those who have cases of mistrust approved against them must resign
- 1912 immediately from their position.

- 1914 Cases of mistrust cannot be taken against student representatives in the University Board, as it goes 1915 against Lov om universiteter og høyskoler § 9-8. (The laws for Universities and Higher schools)

1920 The following documents are to be approved by the Student Parliament:

1937 §8-1-2 Program of Principles

1938 The Program of Principles determines the organization's ground principles and executive political 1939 priorities. The Program of Principles outranks the rest of the Student Parliament's politics.

The Program of Principles shall be treated every 5th year. The Student Parliament can choose to treat 1941

- 1942 the Program of Principles at any time. The Program of Principles shall be treated in two student parliament meetings: with a discussion case in the first meeting and a decision case in the second
- 1943 1944 meeting.
- 1945

1946 §8-1-3 Political platforms

1947 Political platforms determine what the Student Parliament thinks of a certain topic. These shall not go

- 1948 against the Program of Principles, but outside of this, political platforms outrank the rest of the Student
- 1949 Parliament's politics. A document is valid for 5 years. Political platforms shall be processed in two
- 1950 student parliament meetings: with a discussion case in the first meeting, and a decision case in the
- 1951 second meeting.
- 1952

1953 **§8-1-4 Resolutions**

- 1954 Resolutions stipulates what the Student Parliament believes in a particular case. Resolutions can be
- 1955 processed directly.1956

§ 8-2 Instructions for the Student Councils

- 1958 The Student Parliament adopts a standardized instruction for the composition of student councils at
- 1959 NMBU. The Student Parliament decides the structure and composition of Student Councils. The Student
- 1960 Councils have the power to make their own local instructions, but not remove or change the 1961 composition without approval from the Student Parliament.

19621963 § 8-3 Other Instructions

1964 The Student Parliament can approve of other instructions as needed.

1967Chapter 9: Dissolution of the Student Democracy at NMBU

1968 § 9-1 Dissolution

- 1969 Dissolution of the Student Democracy at NMBU must be approved of with a qualified majority amongst
- 1970 present representatives for two consecutive student parliaments. The decision goes into effect after the
- second meeting is adjourned. Proposals for dissolution must be made at least 4 weeks before it is
- handled for the first time, and the first student parliament meeting that handles the case is to be an
- 1973 open meeting where all students at NMBU are called in.

1975 § 9-2 Merging with Other Student Democracies

- 1976 Merging of the Student Democracy at NMBU with other student democracies must be approved of with
- a qualified majority amongst representatives in attendance for two consecutive meetings. Proposals formerging must specify the point in time at which the merge will take place.

1980 Chapter 10: Membership in the Norwegian Student Organization

1981 § 10-1 Membership in the Norwegian Student Organization

- 1982 The Student Democracy at NMBU is a member of the Norwegian student organization (NSO).
- 1983 Withdrawal must follow the protocol of NSOs statutes.

1986Chapter 11: Amendments to the Statues

1987 § 11-1 Submitting of Amendment Proposals

Proposals for amendments of these statutes should be taken to the Student Parliament's Student Board
at least 14 days before the meeting in which they will be addressed, and needs to be made public to all
students at least 7 days before the meeting.

1992 § 11-2 Decisions and Effectiveness

- With a qualified majority vote amongst representatives in attendance, the Student Parliament can
 decide that changes go into effect immediately after they are adopted

- 1996 With a qualified majority, the Student Parliament can bring changed into effect. The Student
- 1997 Parliament's Student Board has the power to make editorial changes in these Statutes. Such changes
- 1998 must be presented for orientation during the first meeting after they are made.

2001 § 12-1 Majority Voting

- 2002 Simple Majority: This means that a proposal receives the most votes
- 2003 50% majority: This means that a proposal receives more than $\frac{1}{2}$ of the votes from participating voters
- 2004 Qualified Majority: This means that a proposal receives 2/3 or more of the votes from the participating 2005 voters
- 2006 Absolute Majority: A proposal receives more than $\frac{1}{2}$ of the total number of votes
- 2007 Absolute Qualified Majority: A proposal receives 2/3 or more of the total number of votes

2016 **Purpose of the instruction**:

This instruction provides an overall insight into the student councils' purpose, function and organization, and shall contribute to them being run equally across the faculties. It is indicative, and each faculty can adapt it to the local conditions. However, it is strongly encouraged that you follow it as closely as possible. The instruction shall be used in the training of new class representatives after the general meetings. The president and vice-president of each faculty are responsible for following up the instructions.

2023 The Student Council's vision:

2024The Student Council's primary task is to organize the class representatives at the faculty level and2025safeguard the students' rights and interests at the faculty. The Student Council is an arena for2026communication and cooperation between class representatives in various councils / committees and2027across fields of study. The Student Council shall contribute to good communication between the2028students and staff at its faculty.

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2030 The Student Council's main tasks:2031 • Be an arena for discussion about

- Be an arena for discussion about local and central issues concerning the students at the faculty.
- To promote the students' interests in all relevant councils and committees at the faculty.
 - All members of the student council are responsible for informing the student council about important matters that are discussed in their councils / committees if there is no exemption from the duty of confidentiality.
 - Discuss issues that are promoted by the students at the faculty and promote them in the relevant council / committee.
- Communicate important information about current issues to the students at the faculty.
- The student councils will discuss student affairs and stay up to date on what is happening in the Student Democracy in general.
 - In collaboration with the Student Parliament's Student Board (AU), ensure that new class representatives are introduced to work tasks and current issues in their new position.
- The Student Council and AU are responsible for ensuring that all members of the Student
 Council agree with these instructions, as well as other documents that are central to the
 performance of their duties.
- The Student Council shall follow up the adopted Annual Wheel and Date Plan for the Student
 Parliament and set up its activities based on these.
 - Conduct a faculty general meeting once a semester.
 - The Student Council shall contribute to the Student Council in particular, and the Student Democracy in general being visible on campus, especially during the buddy week.
 - The Student Council shall also be a social meeting place and is responsible for stimulating academic community for students at the faculty. Where relevant, the student council has the overall responsibility for academic homes.
- The Student Councils shall find student representatives to all positions in committees that
 where not allocated at the respective general assemblies. In regard to representatives that give
 notice in the middle of a term, where there is no substitute for the position, the same rule
 applies. These representatives shall be elected by simple majority at the Student Council
 meeting.

2190	All children in Norway have knowledge about their experience from the system or service they are in
2198	and how they work. The Changefactory conducts systematic surveys for children from all over Norway.

2223	can have great significance in the lives of many children. The rights protect children's legal certainty,
2224	and studies show that if the rights are followed in all circumstances that affects a child, the trust of the
2225	adults working in the services is maintained. This will not only contribute to the children gained
2226	confidence in the professionals of the future, but also give the students concrete tools they can use
2227	when they start working. Then we ensure that they follow Norwegian law. For the future students that
2228	will work with children, to be well equipped to meet this community group in their working life, it is

2247 This is the action plan for student democracy. It has been adopted by the Student Parliament and states 2248 what is desirable for the organization to prioritize working with in the coming year. It is assumed that 2249 continuous assessments are always made and there is an understanding that both needs can change 2250 and that unforeseen things can arise. In addition to the measures in the action plan, the daily operation 2251 of student democracy must be ensured. In the annual report from the Student Board, the various points 2252 in the action plan must be commented on so that Student Parliament is informed about where the 2253 process is and what assessments have been made. The action plan shall not contain policy but shall 2254 contain measures to increase impact of the Student Parliament's policy. The action plan is linked to the 2255 long-term strategy that applies from 2021-2023.
