Words from the Chair

Revision was the keyword in the work within NOVA during the year of 2010 when a new NOVA strategy was prepared. Preparative discussions took locally place and the New NOVA Strategy 2011-2014 was the main focus of the annual seminar in May. At the seminar the secretariat presented major achievements for the strategic period of 2007-2010, and the strengths and weaknesses of the ongoing strategy were discussed. Ideas from the local teams were used as topics for workshops at the seminar. The outcome was used as basis for revision of the strategy, which was discussed further by the local NOVA teams, the Committee of Education and Research (KUF) and the NOVA Board. By the end of the year it was ready for acknowledgement of the Board at its first meeting in 2011.

Networks are at the core of NOVA and criteria for NOVA networks were revised during 2010. The revision was based on discussions within KUF and done in line with revision of the new NOVA strategy. Within NOVA main emphasis is laid on funding of quality PhD courses. During the latter half of the year a revision of the criteria for evaluation of NOVA PhD course applications was started by NOVA KUF. The revised criteria will be used for evaluation of PhD course applications in 2011.

The Annual Seminar 2010 on *New NOVA Strategy 2011-2014 and the Knowledge Triangle; Education, Research and Innovation* was hosted by the Agricultural University of Iceland (LBHI). On 21st of March a small volcanic eruption started on a mountain pass between two glaciers, Eyjafjallajökull and Mýrdalsjökull, lasting for roughly three weeks. This eruption was followed by another eruption in the glacier Eyjafjallajökull, which ashes caused great flight disturbances within Europe and across the Atlantic. NOVA Executive Committee (EC) decided not to postpone the seminar in spite of the eruption, based on long time weather forecasts of favourable winds. Only one participant withdrew attendance due to the eruption and mainly the NOVA Student Board (NSB) representatives experienced delays and problems on their way back home but their annual meeting followed the NOVA seminar. It is of no doubt that the seminar guests who were able to participate in the sightseeing tour towards the eruption will never forget the experience of being so close to the forces of nature. It is also my sincere hope that all NOVA participants do feel the power of the NOVA network itself and how combined forces of the member universities do make us all stronger and more competent in international context.

Activity 2010

PhD education

During 2010 nineteen PhD courses were run, attracting the total of 444 students. The courses were run by the universities as follows: AU-DJF two courses, HU-AF four courses, HU-V two courses, LBHI one course, LIFE five courses, NVH one course, SLU three courses and at UMB two courses were run. Of these courses Quality traits in molecular plant breeding was originally planned to run in 2007 and one course, Modelling climate effects on crops and cropping systems, which was supposed to run in 2011 was moved to fall 2010. The course Soil degradation, erosion and restoration, attracted fewer students than expected, due to volcanic eruption in Iceland and the course Sustainable use of tropical soils attracted unusually high number of non-NOVA students, while given in Ethiopia. Four courses attracted 25 or more NOVA PhD students (Table 1) and the nineteen courses given attracted 331 NOVA student or 17,4 on the average (Table 2). One course, Training researchers to commercialize research was cancelled during 2010.

Two calls for funding of applications for PhD courses were made in 2010; in the spring with deadline April 15th and in the fall with deadline October 15th. 28 NOVA PhD course applications were submitted during spring and autumn call, whereof 22 were granted the total sum of 568.287 EUR. The applications which were not granted did not meet the given NOVA criteria, most commonly they were lacking necessary Nordic dimension. During 2010, the criteria of evaluation of NOVA PhD course applications were revised by NOVA Committee of Education and Research (KUF) and will be put in effect and announced during spring call for PhD course applications in 2011. The Nordic Forest Research Co-operation Committee (SNS) supported four forestry related PhD courses by 4.000 EUR each with total of 16.000 EUR.

MSc education

Student mobility and intensive courses

The framework programme Nordplus, run by the Nordic Council of Ministers finances student and teacher mobility while NOVA funds courses and network projects. Five intensive courses (NIMC) were run during 2010 and one was postponed to 2011.

Mobility of NOVA students is slowly growing from the previous year, with 2,6% of MSc students participating in Nordplus mobility. However it is worth noting that 2009/2010 was the first year of the combined NOVA/BOVA Nordplus Network and therefore actual mobility is higher, as shown in the appendix to the report.

The NOVA /BOVA Nordplus network was granted money to run 1 intensive course in 2009/2010.

No new Erasmus Mundus programmes were supported in 2010, whereas two applications were supported in 2009.

Other activities

Annual seminar and NOVA Strategy

The Annual Seminar on New NOVA Strategy 2011-2014 and the Knowledge Triangle; Education, Research and Innovation was hosted by the Agricultural University of Iceland (LBHI) and held in Selfoss, 57 km East of Reykjavík on the 6th to 7th of May, attracting 75 participants. Prior to the



seminar a decision was made by the NOVA Board to base the revision of the new NOVA strategy on the ongoing one and local NOVA teams at each member institute were responsible for the local work in preparation for the seminar.


Volcanic eruption started in the glacier Eyjafjallajökull in April 2010, having worldwide effects on flight schedules. One participant cancelled participation due to the volcanic activity.

After the seminar a sightseeing tour was offered towards the volcano, to the farm Þorvaldseyri, where seminar guests were able to observe the volcano and its effects on the agricultural fields and last but not least, sense the power of nature.

NOVA Strategy 2007-2010

Prior to the seminar discussion on new strategy was prepared by the member universities and group


discussions took place based on inputs from local NOVA teams. 2010 was the last year of the strategy 2007-2010 and at the seminar the secretariat presented major achievements within the four key strategic areas; NOVA networks, Quality PhD courses, MSc education and Policy forums.



Aims for NOVA Networks were considered reached through the active networks and courses given.

Criteria of NOVA networks were revised in 2010 but further development is needed in the online database, to make environment for MSc education, planning and networking on the NOVA home page more user-friendly. Main emphasis has been put on funding of quality PhD courses; the aim of running 25 courses during the year 2010 attracting 400 students was not quite met. Number of PhD students is above aim by the end of the strategic period 2007-2010, but courses a bit fewer.

In MSc education two joint MSc programmes in Aquaculture and Biosystems engineering have been established, but little effort has been set in joint MSc programmes and education. Summer and winter mobility windows have not been working properly, three planning grants on joint MSc Erasmus Mundus programmes were awarded in 2008, of which two were planned to start in 2010.



Accomplishments were made on internal cooperation with active and effective NOVA networks and

external cooperation, where cooperation with BOVA has been prioritized. Policy forums have been held through annual seminars, seminars of the Board and NSB meetings. In connection to the seminar 2010 BOVA CC and NOVA KUF held a cooperative meeting as previous years. Estimated accomplishments of aims within the four strategic areas of the NOVA Strategy 2007-2010 are presented in Picture 2.

NOVA Strategy 2011-2014

Rotating workshops were held at the seminar on new NOVA strategy, based on the strategy 2007-2010 and inputs from the member universities. Group reports were used as guideline for revision of the existing NOVA strategy 2007-2010. Main changes in the revision regard the MSc education. Summer and winter mobility windows are no longer aimed at, intensive master courses (NIMC) are in focus and no effort set on join MSc programmes and education. Group reports from the annual seminar proved also useful for the secretariat where discussions concerned practical matters regarding daily administrative tasks of the NOVA secretariat.

Revised strategy was discussed at NOVA KUF and Board during the fall, to be acknowledged by the NOVA Board in January 2011.

NOVA Student Board

The NOVA Student Board (NSB) is a freestanding organisation with support from NOVA, giving student's voice into the NOVA network, where NSB has representatives in NOVA Board, KUF and NOVA Executive Committee (EC). NSB held three meetings in 2010 and their representatives participated actively in NOVA Board and KUF bringing up matter of discussion, such as promotional campaign, which has been taken into account in the budget of 2011. Anna Berg Samúelsdóttir acts as chair of NSB from the NSB meeting in May 2010 until May 2011.

NOVA Organizational Bodies

The NOVA Board held three meetings during the year, a video-meeting in January, at Selfoss in May and in Aarhus in October. The Committee for Education and Research (KUF) held four meetings during 2010, two video-meetings, one meeting in Oslo and another in Helsinki. Minutes from the Board and KUF meetings are available on NOVA's home page.

Financial accounts 2010

The NOVA Profit and loss report is presented in Table 5. Previous years the account has been influenced by currency fluctuations, but from 2010, when the secretariat moved to LBHI in Iceland accounting was done in EUR. Most of the costs are handled directly from the EUR account, but LBHI has included currency loss in the secretariat costs, which inevitably occurs in handling of travel and other costs for NSB and the secretariat where credit card is needed.

The main external source of funding has as previously been the Nordic Council of Ministers via the Nordplus framework programme for mobility and other projects. Support has also been given by the Nordic forest Research Cooperation Committee (SNS).
